




Editorial for February 2019

‘Dear Friends, ‘Friend’ is a word we hear almost every day, assume we understand, and yet use in such different ways, depending on the context. We have those friends we see almost every day as we walk down the street; friends who we knew really well years ago, haven’t seen in ages, but can be certain we’d pick up with straight away if we were to see them again; best friends; work friends; even friends on social media who we’ve never met before and can ‘unfriend’ at the touch of a button as soon as we disagree with something they post...

Last November I had the great privilege to visit some very special new friends. I was given the opportunity to travel to Hoima in Uganda, in my capacity as Youth Pastor, to investigate the possibility of taking out a group of our young people in summer 2019. They may never have met me before, but the historical links between our diocese and theirs, mixed with a liberal sprinkling of that famous East African hospitality, meant I was greeted as a long-lost family member and friend from the moment I set foot on the parched ground. Hoima is a town in Western Uganda and part of the diocese of Bunyoro Kitara, which is officially linked with Winchester diocese, and the Odiham Deanery specifically has had a strong and long-standing link with Hoima since the 1980s. This was consolidated in 2008, when the charity ‘Help Hoima’ was established, but none of this quite prepared me for the welcome I received from everyone I met.

One of our first stops was Duhaga Boys’ School. Don’t be put off by the name – they have just as many girls as boys in their 100 strong classes! Fred, the headteacher took great pride in showing us around the school. We sang songs with the children, played with banana-leaf dolls and found out about some of the exciting initiatives the staff and pupils are part of. Then there was pig chasing with Bishop Nathan, sunbathing on the top of a 4x4 as we watched the elephants go by in the local reserve, impromptu Sunday School for over 100 children at All Saints, Hoima, dodging potholes the size of small lakes in the high street, dancing with the teachers at speech day and struggling with language barriers in the 4-hour long ordination service.

Yet the emotional highlight of our trip for me was during one of our many visits to ‘The Mustard Seed’ Children’s Home, when we met Christopher, a young boy with cerebral palsy. He is around 8 or 9 years old, but during our time there he took some of his first few faltering independent steps – trying to get to a toy we’d taken with us. The look of joy on his face when he reached it and the determination he showed making sure no one else took it from him would have made the trip worthwhile on its own! Saying goodbye to this after just over a week was incredibly difficult. So many new experiences, new friends.

So, the words of Bishop Sam as he shook my hand a final time have been ringing in my ears ever since. He said, “I look forward to being good friends with North Hampshire Downs Benefice ...”. But what can that possibly mean? We haven’t known him for years, won’t see him that often, most of us have never met him and we don’t even have that much in common... So how can we possibly be good friends? True friendship involves showing that you care, picking people up when they are down, sharing what you have when they have less. This is something we, in affluent England, are really good at and I can certainly see how that is possible through support of the schools and churches through prayer and more practically with resources. But it doesn’t stop there. A true friend encourages and inspires; pushes you to be the best you can be; helps you to reach out for your dreams. I certainly know my time in Hoima inspired me. Gave me a new zeal for our work here. Encouraged me that all is possible, whatever the hardships we face might be.

A true friend is someone you want to spend time with, talk to, do things together with. So, I am particularly excited to be taking a group of young people out to enjoy some of the once-in-a-lifetime experiences I had. You see, the final and most important part of a good friendship is that it is two way. Before our visit we will be raising money for resources and during it we will be training young people in computer skills – but just as important will be the life-changing visits of our young people to orphanages and schools, joint environmental initiatives with the local diocesan youth and time just getting to know people whose lives are so different from ours. Watch this space and find out how you can be involved!’ Helen Chatfield, Youth Worker for the Benefice.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Local Police Report

“Dear Residents, I am appealing for any information in relation to the burglary of the Royal British Legion at Herriard at about 3am on January 2nd I ask if you had seen anyone out of place in Herriard in the days before, any unusual vehicles. If so, please call direct. Thieves also visited Herriard on the night of January 6th/7th with a farm building, woodshed and garage broken into these between 11:30 pm and 12:30 am, again if you saw any suspicious vehicles please let me know directly.

Turning back to 2018, I am pleased to report a general reduction of twenty-four reported crimes across the whole of my inner beat area consisting of the former beat area BW02 and covering the twenty-two parishes from the Candovers to Newnham south of the M3. I am further pleased to report a reduction of homes being broken into with five reported, of these five, three were preventable. Two were unlocked homes and one was to steal car keys that were clearly visible to see –

on the hall table. Another home was in the process of being built and had no resident and the last resulted in a man being arrested and charged for the offence.

In 2018, in your Parish the following crimes were levels were reported:

Herriard's crime increased with several criminal damage to crops, several crimes at the building site by the Fur & Feathers plus non-dwelling burglaries and thefts from local farms.

Each spring brings me three things that are more prevalent than other seasons, first is an increase in livestock worrying especially sheep. May I also remind all residents who have dogs that the lambing season is again beginning, and we have seen an increase in sheep numbers across our area. Most years I report sheep worrying in our area, I urge all residents to make sure their dogs are on leads near livestock and that they remain on designated footpaths. Farmers do have authority to shoot dogs involved in worrying livestock on farm land, and sadly most dogs will chase sheep if not under control even if only the dog thinks it is a game, but to sheep it is deadly. Please keep YOUR dog under control and on a lead near livestock.

My second problem is garden shed and outbuildings being broken into, last year this was only one of the two types of crimes that increased and whilst happening all year round, spring seems to show an increase, two years back we had the spate of such crime with reports of 5/6 in a night in some areas, I ask please keep sheds secure, use good locks and hasps, record and photograph expensive garden machinery and use marking such as postcodes engraved onto them and consider a shed alarm which can be battery operated and very effective.

My third problem is theft from parked cars in our beautiful area, as spring comes please if you park your car in the countryside do not leave any electrical device, such as laptops etc. in the boot, do not put the handbag under the seat as this is the first place they look. Park your car in a busy area with other walkers being about or leave it in the village and walk from there.

We do have criminals who will be out and about in our beauty spot areas, just like the criminals who stole the car from the burglary later used in the theft of a cash machine from Swindon, sadly they are always about and will never miss an opportunity if you give it to them. Upton Grey Parish Council: New Councillor: It's all about YOU!

Are YOU concerned about the local area? Would YOU like to represent the views of other local people in the parish? Would YOU like the opportunity to make a real difference in the community? If so, then YOU could make a great councillor for Upton Grey Parish Council. In May 2019 there will be an opportunity for you to become a parish councillor. Contrary to popular belief you don't have to have specific qualifications to be a councillor and the Parish Council isn't connected to a political party. You must be over 18 but other than that you can be any age, male or female.

There are some criteria that you must meet however, you must be:

- A British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth, or the European Union
- Be an elector of the parish or work in the parish. Or live within 3 miles of the parish boundary.

As a councillor, you would be expected to attend monthly meeting, but this also means that YOU will have the opportunity to participate in the council's decisions. Maybe you have some good ideas about potential improvements in the village. Perhaps you have some business or personal expertise that could contribute to the work of the Parish Council in your community. It's not all about planning applications! As a parish councillor you would also help to set the precept. The precept is the proportion of your council tax which is allocated to the Parish Council. You would help to plan the annual budget for the council and help the council decide on how best to spend that budget. YOU would be a voice of your community and could help to make a real change. Perhaps there is someone you would like to nominate to be a parish councillor who you think would represent your interests and be an asset to the Parish Council? Herriard Gardening Club

This month sees the start of our monthly meetings at each other's houses where we start to plan jobs at the allotment in Back Lane and share our interest in plants and gardening practices. In January, our first get together to welcome the new year and to banish the winter blues, was an excellent dinner at The Anchor in Froyle. If you are on a New Year detox, one vegetable to include for its health-giving properties, is spinach. Try growing your own this year. Spinach is a leafy green vegetable that is available all year round. It is known for its nutritional qualities, rich in iron and an excellent source of vitamins K, A, C and folate. It also contains important carotenoids. Raw spinach contains oxalic acid, which can interfere with the absorption of calcium and iron. Oxalic acid is broken down when heated so there is no loss of nutrients in steamed or sautéed spinach. Its high-water content means spinach reduces in size when cooked. Spinach can be sown from early spring (under fleece or cloches) or outdoors from mid-March. Before sowing, dig in well-rotted organic matter and general fertiliser. Thin seedlings 3 ins apart when large enough to handle. Keep well-watered during dry periods and protect from birds with netting or fleece. Spring sowings should be ready to harvest within 12 weeks.

Recipe of the month: Pat's Spinach and Courgette Soup: Serves 4

2 large courgettes diced

1 medium onion coarsely chopped

1 medium potato peeled and diced

1 ltr vegetable or chicken stock

200g spinach; 2 tablespoons oil; Salt & Pepper to taste

- 1) In a large saucepan, heat oil and sauté onions for a few minutes then add courgette and cook for another few minutes
- 2) Add potato, spinach, and stock, simmer for about 20 minutes, until potato is cooked
- 3) Use a blender to purée until smooth, add salt and pepper to taste and more stock/water if needed
- 4) Serve with either a dollop of Soft Cracked Black Peppered Cheese (my preference) or double cream / creme fraiche

If you want a creamier soup just add 225ml cream after blending and warm through, but do not boil. I always triple the ingredient whilst making this and freeze down for another day. Enjoy with some crusty bread. Gill Hill.

Odiham Consolidated Charities Donation of equipment to Odiham Health Centre



Richard Janaway, the Chairman of Odiham Consolidated Charities (OCC), Dr David Love and two other Trustees from the charity attended Odiham Surgery recently to present some equipment which the surgery required, and which OCC was pleased to be able to fund.

The main item was a spirometer, which is a clever piece of kit that measures the rate of flow of breath that is being forcibly exhaled. It measures both the volume of breath and the speed that it can be exhaled at. Add in some sophisticated calculations carried out by a computer and medical staff can diagnose a range of lung conditions, such as asthma, chronic obstructive airways disease and pulmonary fibrosis, as well as monitor their progress.

The second piece of equipment which OCC funded was a Doppler probe, which is an ultrasound device that detects fluid moving and its rate of flow in an artery. This is non-invasive and can be done through the outer layers of the body. This is primarily used to look for arterial problems in the legs in those patients who are symptomatic or have multiple risk factors. The photo above is of Dr David Love, OCC Trustee, and Dr Bates from the surgery. The Trustees of OCC hope to be able to work with doctors at the surgery in future on other equipment requirements to assist with the diagnosis and treatment of a range of conditions.

Odiham And Old Basing Health Centre Patient Participation Group: Obesity

At this time of year when many of us consider making New Year's resolutions, we thought this a good opportunity to highlight OBESITY. The impact of obesity is wide ranging, affecting a person in many ways, but it is also having a significant impact on our NHS.

WHAT IS OBESITY? Obesity is a medical term used for people who are overweight. In the UK this is classified using the BMI measurement (calculation made on your height and weight). A calculator for this measurement is easily found on the internet, it is your weight in kilograms divided by the square of your height in metres.

BMI thresholds: 18.5 - 24.9 is healthy, 25 - 29.9 is overweight, any value above 30 is classified as obese. Another measure is waist circumference, which in people with a raised BMI, can be an indicator of excess fat. A raised waist circumference for anyone with a BMI over 25 (in men greater than 37in/94cm, in women greater than 31.5in/80cm) is an indicator of increased health risk.

CAUSES OF OBESITY. The cause is generally thought to be related to an increase in our intake of high fat and high sugar foods, an increase in our use of processed foods, physical inactivity, more sedentary lifestyles and consuming more food than is needed (increased portion sizes). There are other factors, but these are the main areas that can be addressed by making some lifestyle changes.

HOW DOES OBESITY AFFECT ME? Obesity increases our risk of serious health conditions:

- Type 2 Diabetes
- Coronary heart disease
- High blood pressure (hypertension)
- Cancer – breast cancer and bowel cancer (other types also)
- Stroke
- Osteoarthritis
- Sleep apnoea (a condition that causes interrupted breathing during sleep, which can lead to daytime sleepiness with an increased risk of road traffic accidents, as well as a greater risk of diabetes, high blood pressure and heart disease)
- Reduced fertility
- Liver disease and kidney disease
- Gallstones

On a day to day basis, obesity can cause:

- Psychological problems – low mood, depression, poor self-esteem, social isolation
- Breathlessness
- Increased sweating
- Snoring
- Difficulty doing physical activity
- Feeling very tired
- Joint and back pain
- Gastro-oesophageal reflux

Obesity reduces life expectancy by an average of 3 to 10 years, depending on how severe it is. It's estimated that obesity and being overweight contribute to at least 1 in every 13 deaths in Europe. There's no quick fix for obesity.

WHAT CAN WE DO TO REDUCE OBESITY? The best way to address obesity is to eat a healthy, reduced-calorie diet and exercise regularly. Before you start to make changes to reduce obesity consider the following: Motivation is crucial: no weight loss plan will work unless you have a serious desire to lose weight. You need to be ready and motivated. Monitor your current food intake: it is helpful to know exactly how much you currently eat. Keeping a detailed diary of everything that you eat and drink over an average week is more helpful. Aim to lose weight gradually: it is best not to lose weight too fast. Aim to lose an average of 0.5 to 1 kg per week (about 1-2 lb. per week). Set clear goals with a realistic timescale: it is important to set a clear and realistic weight loss goal.

Diet: Common problems to consider: Avoid processed foods, there are usually lots of hidden sugars and they are generally higher in fat. Be careful about what you drink – alcohol is high in calories, fruit juices whilst making up one of your five a day are also very high in sugar and therefore calories. Look at portion sizes, a common problem as we eat more than a recommended portion size, an interesting guide to portion sizes is as follows and can be used as a guide for ‘one portion’:

- Carbohydrate: Pasta, rice, couscous = 1 tennis ball, Potatoes = 1 computer mouse, 70g bread = 2 slices or 1 large roll, 60g noodles = 1 dried noodle nest
- Protein: Meat = 1 deck of playing cards, Fish = 1 cheque book, Cheese = a standard matchbox
- Fruit and Vegetables: Vegetables = 1 cricket ball, Salad = 1 medium cereal bowl, Medium fruits (apples, bananas, pears) = 1 fruit, Small fruits (plums, satsumas, kiwis) = 2 fruits, Berries = 1 tennis ball

It is suggested that we should aim to eat at least 5 portions of fruit and/or vegetables each day, and 2 or more portions of fish each week. Consider how you cook food and try to avoid saturated fats in cooking, aiming for the healthier fats such as olive oil.

Exercise. Physical inactivity is a key factor in the development of obesity. Increasing your activity levels has many health benefits, as well as helping to reduce obesity (with a reduction in calorie intake). Health benefits of exercise include a reduction in depression, improvement in muscle tone to help reduce the impact of osteoarthritis, reduction in blood pressure, reduction in the risk of heart disease and stroke, protection against osteoporosis to mention just a few. Current recommendations suggest at least 30minutes of moderate physical activity on 5 days of each week.

Moderate activity should be enough for you to feel slightly out of breath, mildly hot and sweaty. Do remember that even 10mins regularly is better than nothing. Always try to look for ways to increase your activity levels, for example, get off the bus a stop earlier, take the stairs rather than the lift. There are many ways nowadays for people to become more active, the NHS website supports the couch to 5k programme, there are local steady and strong classes and a walking for health group for older patients, and there are a multitude of gyms, exercise classes and personal trainers in our area so there should be something to suit all. Remember that even losing what seems like a small amount of weight, such as 3% or more of your original body weight, and maintaining this for life, can significantly reduce your risk of developing obesity-related complications like diabetes and heart disease. We wish you all a happy healthy 2019!

The National Garden Scheme In Hampshire

Recent research has shown that only a small percentage of the population is aware of the amazing contributions this organisation has donated to nursing and caring charities. The concept is that owners of quality gardens, be they large estates or more modest town gardens, agree to open their gardens, through the National Garden Scheme (NGS), to the public on specific days or 'By Arrangement' on other dates, for a private visit. For this privilege, visitors pay a modest entrance fee (has been described as England and Wales' 'best value day out'). All entrance money is donated to the NGS. In most gardens' homemade cakes and tea or coffee are available. Many gardens have plants for sale or offer local crafts people the chance to sell their goods - a percentage of which goes to the NGS. All the money raised throughout England & Wales is distributed to nursing & caring charities, the main ones being Macmillan Cancer Support, Marie Curie and Hospice UK. Several very generous amounts are also donated to other charities including Parkinson's UK, National Autistic Society and the Queen's Nursing Institute. All the charities supported by the NGS can be viewed at ngs.org.uk/beneficiaries.

In 2018 the NGS donated a record £3.1 million to these deserving charities. For the last 4 years Hampshire has raised the most money of any County, exceeding £200,000 per year. Keep an eye open for the Yellow NGS County Booklet. This is available at most garden centres or visit the website ngs.org.uk to see which NGS gardens are open. You can be sure of a very warm welcome at all our gardens - and at the same donate to an amazing charity.

Check out our Snowdrop Festival in February. This year we have four gardens open: Bramdean House, Alresford; The Down House, Itchen Abbas; Little Court, Crawley, Winchester; and Chawton House Library, Alton.
