## Editorial for May 2019: Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

'Many years ago, just before the war, there was a hugely successful play by Dodie Smith called 'Dear Octopus'. It was a comedy about a family celebrating a golden wedding, with the interplay between the different generations, who called the family 'Dear Octopus' because its tentacles reached out and bound them together. The Octopus was always there, and it gave them security and stability and companionship.

I think of it often, because I am fortunate enough to belong to a Dear Octopus, but I like to think of the ideal Octopus as reaching beyond the immediate family to the society in which we live. Close friends are virtually indistinguishable from family members (remember how as children we had extra 'uncles' and 'aunts'?), and our wider Octopus could include those people outside our circle of friends who nevertheless are part of our lives because we work with them or trade with them or regularly bump into them as we go about our everyday lives. I suppose our Octopus may even include the odd animal or bird.

Humans are social creatures. We are not designed to be solitary and alone, and if we are solitary and alone, we can't fully function as we are meant to function. Yet there are far more people in our society who are solitary and alone than we may realise. They tend not to be noticed because they don't get around very much. It is more than likely that many will go through the day without speaking to anybody at all. There are many causes of loneliness: separation from home; bereavement; personal weakness; persecution; migration. Elijah was lonely because he had stood up for God when those around him had turned away (1 Kings 19:10). Even Jesus was lonely in Gethsemane (Matthew 26:38). Those of us fortunate enough to have a Dear Octopus might profitably wonder whether it could reach out to someone who is solitary and alone. Surely its tentacles are long enough to embrace one or two more? Perhaps over a cup of coffee?'

## Five-Finger Prayer

There are other ways we can remember how to pray – one of my favourites is the 5-finger prayer. How to do it...

Give yourself a thumbs up and then point your thumb to yourself.

Thumb (people who are close to you) These are your close friends and family, often the first you think about when you pray. Give thanks to God and ask his protection on your

parents, siblings, friends, and classmates.

Pointer (people who point the way) These are leaders in your life, such as teachers and pastors. Thank God for them and ask him to help them in their important work. Tall Finger (people in authority) The big people in the world need prayer too. Ask God to give wisdom to our government, military, and police.

Ring Finger (people who are weak) This is your weakest

## **Local Police Report**

'Dear residents, May I make a plea to all residents, if unfortunately, you are the victim of a crime please report it.

I am seeking any assistance regarding a theft from the scaffolding company in the Bidden Road, Upton Grey. Between 5 pm on April 10<sup>th</sup> and 6.45 on April 11th, 2019 thieves have gained entry into the field behind and cut a hole in the security fencing and stolen property valued at about £8,000. I ask if anyone saw any unusual activity at the site or in the field behind during these times to please give me a call direct.


Recently in our area a secure office within a secure compound was broken into and an item valued at £40 was stolen. The Police were not made aware of this and the thieves appear to have used this as a dummy run as they returned some weeks later broke in again and stolen property. In the Old Basing, Chineham areas and, in the west near Oakley, we have been experiencing an increase in theft from vehicles in the early hours of the morning. In the Oakley area it is predominately works vans that are being targeted with a black estate car similar to a BMW has been seen with two men loading up tools stolen from works vans. If you use a van for work please take tools out at night, if this is not possible try to park the vehicle with the doors against a wall or close to another vehicle to stop the rear doors being opened.

...And finally, now we are in to spring please be aware of the seasonal increase in theft of tools from garden sheds and items usually handbags from parked cars in our beauty spots. For expensive tools please mark them and record serial numbers, for expensive items please take photographs. For vehicles parked up please DO NOT leave stealable items in the car, remove sat-navs and any electrical items that thieves using equipment can now detect in your vehicle, even in the boot. ## Support your Village Shop

The village shop needs your support. Go with a flexible attitude and you will not find it difficult to find enough ingredients for plenty of tasty meals. Over the next few months the parish magazine will contain just a few recipe ideas that can be made entirely with ingredients from the village shop. Although most of these will have a vegetarian bias, they can often be supplemented with meat if desired. If you find that the shop happens to have run out of something listed below, be patient - all these items are usually in stock. (Please bear in mind these quantities are a bit approximate - I don't use a recipe book!). Tess.

## This Month's 'Village Shop' Recipe: Vegetable Fajitas (Serves 4)

This is a family favourite. It is fairly quick and easy and makes a good lunch or light supper. Most of the ingredients are reliably in stock at all times. But if one or two of the vegetables are missing, it doesn't matter - just buy more of one of them or swap for mushrooms. Mince or pieces of fried chicken could be added if wished.

### **Ingredients**

1 onion (chopped)

1 red or yellow pepper (chopped)

1 aubergine (sliced)

1 courgette (sliced)

1/2 tin of sweetcorn (drained)

1 tin of kidney beans (drained)

1/2 tin of tomatoes (or tomato puree)

1 clove garlic

Fresh coriander (if not available try the coriander pesto from the shop)

Spices: ground cumin, ground coriander, chilli or cayenne pepper

1 packet of corn tortillas

You may also wish to add lettuce, grated cheese of your choice, salsa sauce, Greek yogurt, homemade guacamole (if avocados are soft)

**Method:** Fry the onion and garlic in a deep frying-pan or saucepan until the onion is softening. Add the pepper, aubergine and lastly courgette; with some seasoning and spices to taste (not too much chilli unless you like it really spicy) and fry all together until vegetables are soft.

If using mince, you could add it at this point and fry until well cooked. Add the kidney beans, 1/2 tin of sweetcorn and as much of the tin of tomatoes to make a thickish sauce (it shouldn't be too runny). Let it simmer for a while until all the flavours are mixed together (you can add more spices at this point if wished). Finally add the fresh coriander or a spoonful or two of coriander pesto.

**To serve:** fill a corn tortilla wrap with a large spoonful of sauce, add chopped lettuce, and either fried chicken, grated cheese, yogurt, salsa, or guacamole (or all of them!). Fold in the sides of the wrap to enclose all ingredients and eat!

When the Upton Grey School was sold after its closure in the 1980s, half of the proceeds went to the village and the Upton Grey Educational Trust was formed. The income from the sale proceeds, invested by the charity, can be used twice yearly "for the advancement of education". The Trust meets in June and December each year to consider applications for assistance with educational needs, **from any age group and with no means testing**. Since the Trust was set up, it has awarded grants to over 90 applicants and 15 groups in addition to Long Sutton School. ## Time On Your Hands? Feeling A Bit Brain Dead? Need A Challenge?



Have your circumstances changed recently (children started school? Recently retired? A student requiring work experience?).

If you now find you have got some time for you and would like to fill it with something stimulating and interesting then why not consider volunteering at Citizens Advice? Many people don't realise that Citizens Advice is a charity giving information and advice on a variety of subjects. Furthermore, it is very much dependant on volunteers like us!

'I decided to go for it because I wanted something that was not only flexible around the school run but also would give me the school holidays to spend with the children. Being able to choose my own hours was hugely beneficial to me and one of the major draws of this charity. I also hadn't been in the workplace for a number of years, so didn't feel I had the confidence for a 'proper job'. Volunteering for a couple of half days per week has increased my knowledge and re-built my confidence. I also wanted to do something to help in the local community, but I know I'm not a committee person. For me, Citizens Advice offered a role that was much more 'hands on'. Every day you find yourself face to face with clients with real issues who need us. By helping them solve their problems, a volunteer can experience real satisfaction with the knowledge you have actually made a difference to a client's life.' You get plenty of training and the information is at your fingertips. So, what does a typical day entail? There are many roles that you can volunteer for; whether it be as a Receptionist, Administrator, Assessor or Advisor. 'One day I may have a client who is homeless and needs help getting somewhere to stay, another who has got bailiffs knocking at their door, one may just want to know how to apply for a Blue Badge pass. Whether big or small, the problems people experience are real to them and they are always grateful to have the help. Sometimes so much so that cake and/or flowers appear!'

## Odiham & Old Basing Patient Participation Group - Summer Health <a href="Travel">Travel</a>

1. Vaccinations – many of us travel abroad over the summer months. For some country's vaccinations are needed. Please ensure you have left enough time to have any vaccinations you may need, as some vaccines require a course of injections. The practice nurse will be able to check which vaccinations you may need and advise about malaria risk. Book a telephone call with the practice nurse. Remember travel vaccinations are not available on the NHS so the practice will charge you for these.

- 2. **Medications.** If you need to take medication abroad with you check with your airline and your destination of travel to ensure there are no restrictions on this. Some countries do not allow you to travel with certain painkillers and some airlines require you to have written documentation that the medication you are carrying is prescribed by a doctor.
- 3. **Long haul flights.** Consider the risk of deep vein thrombosis when on a flight longer than 4 hours. This is a clot in a deep vein in your leg which can lead to swelling and pain in that leg up to one month after your flight. To try to minimise the risk remain as mobile as possible whilst on the flight; consider exercises on the flight whilst sitting for example making small circles with your ankles and pointing your toes up and down; remain well hydrated; avoid alcohol on the flight.

### **Hayfever**

The hayfever season often starts at the end of February/early March and runs through to September. Common presentations include: itchy eyes, red watery eyes, runny nose, scratchy throat, sinus discomfort, headaches. There is no cure for hayfever, but there are some simple things you can try which may help to relieve the symptoms:

- Put Vaseline around your nostrils to trap pollen
- Wear wrap-around sunglasses to limit pollen getting to the eyes
- Shower and change your clothes after you've been outside/come in
- You can buy pollen filters for the air vents in your car
- Anti-histamine tablets, steroid nasal sprays, eye drops these can be bought from your local pharmacist, the NHS is trying to encourage patients not to ask for these on prescription. These medications need to be started before the hay fever season begins and continued daily throughout the season.

## **Insect Bites And Stings**

As the weather warms up, so do biting insects. It is not always possible to know what insect has bitten / stung you but the effects can be uncomfortable and sore. A red lump or swelling is usually seen. This can increase in size over the first few hours or couple of days. Most bites and stings are self-limiting and can be self-managed. Please take an antihistamine tablet regularly, following the advice on the packet. An antihistamine cream can also be bought which can help with itching and irritation. Consider applying a cold flannel or cloth. If a sting is visible, try to remove it. Try to avoid scratching the area. With the above management the area of redness and irritation should gradually recede over a couple of days, but it can last for up to a week.

If you start to feel unwell, the redness or swelling seems to be spreading, or you develop flu - like symptoms you should speak to the GP in case the bite/sting has become infected.

### Sunburn

This is caused by spending too much time in the sunshine which leads to red, hot, sore skin. The skin may itch and peel after a few days. To manage this come out of the sunshine, use a cool towel or cloth on the skin to help cool it down, apply a soothing lotion such as after sun or aloe vera, keep well hydrated drinking plenty of fluids, take simple painkillers if needed. The NHS website has useful information on all of the above plus many more. It is definitely worth a look before you call the doctor or consider speaking to your local pharmacist for advice. <a href="www.nhs.uk">www.nhs.uk</a>. There is more information available from the surgery and on the NHS England website about this. You may therefore find that you are asked to buy certain medications from your local pharmacy, that you have previously received on prescription. We hope we get some sunshine and can all enjoy a lovely summer!


