Message from the benefice Clergy Team

As you will be aware the Church of England has, in line with government guidance, suspended all Sunday services and mid-week gatherings for the foreseeable future. In a joint letter the Archbishops of Canterbury and York have shared that:

‘Being a part of the Church of England is going to look very different in the days ahead. Our life is going to be less characterised by attendance at church on Sunday, and more characterised by the prayer and service we offer each day. This is a defining moment for the Church of England. Are we truly a church for all, or just the church for ourselves? We urge you sisters and brothers to become a different sort of church in these coming months: hopeful and rooted in the offering of prayer and praise and overflowing in service to the world.’

Worshipping Together

We are committed to providing opportunities for people to join together in worship either online or through resources that can be emailed or posted out.

On Sunday 22nd March we live-streamed two services: 10.00am Holy Communion (a more traditional service) and 11.15am Informal Worship (a more contemporary service), and our aim is to stream services every Sunday, with each service generally 20-30 minutes in length and including hymns or songs, Bible readings, a short reflection, and times of prayer. We are also continuing with midweek worship, live streaming an 8:30am Morning Prayer every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday: 15 minutes in length, with a Psalm, a Bible reading, and a short time of prayer. The services are on our new Facebook page www.facebook.com/north.hampshire.downs.churches, and there is a link to it on our website www.moretolife.church.

Our aim is to leave the live-stream videos on the page through the day in case you can't make the start time.

If you have no access to online resources, please contact the church office on 01256 703791 and we will do our best to get some printed resources delivered. Let us not stop worshipping together, even if it has to look a little different for a while.

Prayer Requests

Please be assured that as a clergy team we are praying for all in our communities. If you have a specific prayer request, please email it to prayer-requests@moretolife.church. All the clergy team have access to that email address and will be praying for requests daily. If you like we can also include your request in our intercessions during our live-streamed services. If you would like us to do this, please indicate in your email.

Supporting our Communities

In these challenging times it is important we seek to be Good Samaritans to each other. We are encouraging all those who are safely able to do so to offer support to their neighbours. Even if you are self-isolating, we encourage you to commit to pray daily for your neighbours and community. If there is anything, we can do to help you during this time please let us know by dropping an email to simon@moretolife.church. This could be picking up shopping or medication, a regular phone call or another urgent task. Let us be those who take care of others and share God's love with our neighbours.

Open Churches

We are committed, as far as is possible, to keeping our church buildings open in the coming weeks. We hope these can be places of sanctuary for quiet prayer and reflection. We would ask that you wash your hands before entering the church and after leaving and please ensure that you remain at least 2m away from other people in the building. We will continue collections for the Foodbank at a time of increased need. Let us be those who are generous to those who are struggling.

Sharing Good News

Finally, as churches we are called to be light in the darkness, and we would love to encourage you to share good news stories with each other. Whether that is a particularly helpful neighbour, a surprise phone call or a beautiful picture you have taken in your garden. You could share these on our Facebook page or on other community groups. Let us be people who spread light and hope.

Easter Christingles

Easter is almost here, and most of us will be looking forward to eating eggs (of the chocolate variety!) on Easter day. Not so in Dunstable, just North of London, where they will be grabbing their oranges and going to nearby Dunstable Hills! There they all stand in a line and roll them down a hill... This tradition helps them remember the story of Easter. The orange reminds them of the stone that sealed Jesus' tomb when He was buried. When they roll it down the hill, it represents when the stone was rolled away on Easter morning, the grave was empty, and Jesus was not there. The sadness the disciples had felt on Good Friday, when Jesus had died on the cross, had miraculously changed to the joy of Easter Sunday, when He had risen from the dead.

The Dunstable oranges got me thinking... Who remembers Christingles? We make them at Christmas each year to remind us of Jesus coming into our world as a baby. So, I got to wondering if we could make Easter Christingles to remember Him dying and rising back again. Let's give it a go!

- Find an orange – this represents the stone which was rolled away on Easter morning.
- Inside the top of the orange, wrapped up in foil at the base, is a white candle. It represents the light of Christ, white and pure, come into the world (just like at Christmas).
- Four pieces of garden dowelling are tied together to make two crosses, either side of the candle, representing the two thieves.
- Cocktail sticks, stuck around the top of the orange, represent the crown of thorns.
- Three pieces of wool are plaited together, red for blood, black for death, purple for Jesus' robe. They are fixed around the orange, with a drawing pin, representing the nails.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Local Police Report

Dear residents

I start this month with an excellent piece of news. Back in August 2019 a local resident saw a lady dumping her rubbish on Lee Farm Lane, Herriard, he recorded the registration number and spoke with the lady concerned who subsequently drove away. He located certain information that led to him checking a social media site in which the same lady had her picture. I was called and went to the area and took evidential photographs and seized certain parts of the rubbish. I completed a file which was handed to the Borough Council who interviewed the lady and subsequently prosecuted her. On March 12th, 2020 the lady Mrs. Le Besque pleaded guilty and was fined £670, costs awarded against her of £963.20, a Victim Surcharge of £67, totalling **£1,700.20**, for her to pay. A truly excellent result. I wish to thank the resident concerned for his help and assistance within this matter. And now sadly on to other news, I am seeking any information in relation to several outbuildings being broken into after a set of electric wooden gates were forced open. This took place at a house in Basingstoke Road Upton Grey, just before leaving the village, between February 29th and March 2nd, I am aware that the thieves are likely to have parked or at least forced the gates of Upton Grey House. Garden equipment was stolen from this crime scene.

In the same road between February 10th and 14th a shed in the grounds of a house was forcibly broken into with what we suspect was a crowbar on the lock. Nothing was stolen. I ask if anyone saw anyone or any vehicle at this entrance to please give me a call direct, and as always, all calls are treated in strictest confidence.

I am also aware of recent issues concerning speeding vehicles through the village, I can assure you that I will endeavour to be out again soon with speed enforcement equipment.

A Talk on Ethiopia given by Geoffrey and Frances Yeowart at St Mary's Upton Grey, February 2020

We often pray for Christians in foreign lands who risk persecution. You may be interested to read about a country where the Christian faith is strong and thriving – Ethiopia.

Ethiopia is a landlocked republic in the Horn of Africa bordered by Sudan, Eritrea, Djibouti, Kenya and Somalia. Roughly twice the size of France, the landscape is dominated by the dramatically mountainous Ethiopian Highlands. With an average altitude of 2,000 metres, the region is bisected by the Rift Valley and is the source of the Blue Nile.

Ethiopia's population is about 108 million, the 12th largest in the world. Roughly 40% of the population is aged 16 or under and roughly 40% still also live on or below the poverty line, living on \$1 per day. Some 17 languages are spoken, with Amharic being the most important. English is taught in secondary schools. Ethiopians are a handsome race with a strong Arab influence – dark skinned with high cheek bones and slim.

The capital is Addis Ababa at 7,000 feet. Ethiopia is the only country in Africa, apart from Liberia, which was not colonised. It's justly proud of this fact. It was occupied by the Italians in 1936 but liberated by the Allies in 1941. Addis Ababa is home to the headquarters of the Organisation of African Union.

The economy is dominated by agriculture which employs 80% of the labour force, with coffee being a key export. Coffee drinking is a national pastime. The Ethiopian Highlands are fertile and the farming methods traditional, little changed since biblical times. We did not see a tractor during our whole stay, nor indeed, outside the cities, a private car on the roads.

Ethiopia has an ancient history and is almost certainly where modern human beings evolved. The hominid skeleton found in the Rift Valley - better known as Lucy - is thought to be 3.5 million years old.

Up to 1974 Ethiopia was an empire with a feudal system of government. The empire had its roots in the Axumite Empire. The empire reached its peak between the 1st and 7th centuries AD, stretching from Sudan in the west across the Red Sea to Yemen and beyond. It traded as far afield as Europe and India.

In 1974 a Marxist inspired military regime – known as the Derg – seized control of the country and murdered the last emperor, Haile Selassie. The Derg held power until 1991. It was so ruthless, cruel and unpopular that opposition groups in Eritrea and the north rebelled, starting an armed conflict. A major famine also occurred in 1985, exacerbated by the war and leading to Bob Geldof's *Live Aid*. The Derg finally collapsed after the fall of the Berlin Wall, when support from Russia and Cuba fell away. Eritrea became independent.

Since 1991 Ethiopia has moved towards a more democratic system and now has one of the fastest growing economies in the world. Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2019 but the land border with Eritrea is still closed.

Christianity, Judaism and Islam have strong historical roots. Roughly 44% belong to the Ethiopian Orthodox Church, while 19% are catholic or protestant and 34% are Muslim. The orthodox church dominates in the north and west.

Christianity was brought to Ethiopia in the 4th century in the unlikely form of 2 shipwrecked boys from Syria. The boys were found under a tree quietly reading their lessons. They were taken into the Emperor's court and grew up to become trusted advisers, converting the Emperor to Christianity. One of them, Frumentios, became the first Archbishop of Ethiopia.

The orthodox church has historical links with the Christian community in Egypt, but Ethiopian Orthodoxy has developed differently from Coptic Christianity. The bible is written in Geez, the language of the Axumite empire, and has 16 more chapters than our own bible.

The orthodox religion is a unique mix of Christian fundamentals with Judaic influences: both the Christian sabbath of Sunday and the Jewish sabbath of Saturday are recognised; fasting days and religious dancing are included; and male circumcision is practised. Ethiopia never replaced the Julian calendar with the revised Gregorian calendar, as did the West in 1582. So, we are all 7 years and 8 months younger in Ethiopia!

Most intriguing, there is a deep mystery at the heart of the orthodox religion relating to the Ark of the Covenant. Ethiopians are convinced that the original Ark was brought to Ethiopia in the first millennium BC and now rests at Axum in the Maryam Tsion Church. Only the official guardian is permitted to see it.

Each church has a *tabot* kept in its Holy of Holies. This is a replica of one of the Tablets of the Law placed in the Ark by Moses. The *tabot* is only removed on important religious days. While in Axum we were fortunate to see the *tabot* procession and special celebration of TimKat, the Ethiopian Epiphany.

The story of how the Ark came to Axum is a colourful one. According to legend, when the Queen of Sheba visited King Solomon, an intimate relationship developed between them. On her return home the Queen gave birth to a son – Menelik. At the age of 22, Menelik visited his father in Jerusalem and stayed with him for 3 years. Despite being Solomon's eldest son, he decided to return to Ethiopia.

Solomon permitted him to go but decreed that he be accompanied by the eldest sons of his high commissioners drawn from the 12 tribes of Israel – about 1,000 young men. One of these was Azariah, the eldest son of the High Priest. He was told in a dream that he should take with him the Ark of the Covenant and did so. On Menelik's return to Ethiopia, his Mother abdicated in his favour and he founded the Solomonic dynasty which continued almost unbroken until 1974.

This might seem a touch far-fetched but, on the other hand, is it purely coincidental that the orthodox religion has strong Judaic characteristics and that a substantial community of Ethiopian Jews - the Beta Israel - existed up to 1985 (when they were airlifted to Israel during the famine)? One of the glories of the Ethiopian Orthodox religion are the rock hewn churches, particularly in the province of Tigray, the birthplace of Ethiopian Christianity. The earliest are thought to date from the 8th century and typically, are well concealed in the mountains, often on the summit. The Debra Tsion, for instance, takes over an hour of fairly arduous climbing to reach. There are several different types and styles of church; some have been carved out of natural caves while others have been excavated top-down out of solid rock.

The underground churches at Lalibela, perched at over 8,000 feet in a landscape of wild craggy peaks, rank amongst the Wonders of the World. They are different to most of the other churches as cut in one piece from the solid rock and often connected by tunnels. The northern cluster includes Bet Medhane Alem (House of the Saviour of the World); reputed to be the largest rock hewn monolith in the world, it is modelled on King

Solomon's Temple in Jerusalem. King Lalibela's concept was apparently to create a new Jerusalem, after the fall of Jerusalem in 1187 to Saladin. A low, pitch-black tunnel leads to a trio of other churches. Emerging from the tunnel into the bright light is meant to give the impression of ascending into heaven. It is a popular shrine for pilgrims.

The southern cluster includes Bet Giyorgis which is dedicated to St George. It's often shown in photographs with its iconic cross carved into the structure of the rock roof. Like many rock hewn churches, the interior is sparsely furnished but atmospheric.

Ethiopian churches have been decorated with wall paintings ever since the introduction of Christianity in the 4th century. The painting is distinctive: highly stylised with bright colours, depicting the life of Christ and scenes from the Ethiopian bible including the miracles of St Mary and those of Ethiopia's own saints. The scenes are very pictorial and the tradition continues in the modern new churches of today.

Ethiopia is unlike any other country that we have visited. Christianity is deeply embedded in the national character of the people whom we met. We were told that, when the Anglican and Catholic clerics and American evangelists expelled by the Derg were able to return to Ethiopia, they expected to find that their churches had dwindled or even ceased to exist. Not only did they find the churches still there but thriving like never before. The congregations had taken power into their own hands!

Recipe of the month: Spiced Parsnip Soup

55g butter

680g parsnips

1 onion

1 stick celery

1 clove garlic

1-2 teaspoon curry powder

1Half teaspoon cinnamon

Half teaspoon cumin

1200ml chicken or vegetable stock Salt and pepper to taste

140ml single cream

Melt butter in pan and sweat chopped onions, garlic, celery and parsnips. Add the spices, stir well and cook for 3 mins. Add stock and simmer for approx. 30 mins. Adjust seasoning. Cool slightly then liquidise. Add cream prior to serving. *Serves 8*
