Letter from the Ministry Team

As I write this, the question on everyone's lips seems to be: will Christmas be cancelled?

The various media outlets offer wildly different views ranging from prophecies of a Christmas without family, friends or fun (and presumably just coal in our stockings) to glad tidings of 'it will all be over by Christmas'.

One thing that seems at least relatively certain is that Christmas 2020 will be rather different from Christmas 2019, 2018 etc etc.



But I find myself wondering, is that altogether a bad thing? Of course not having the whole extended family to visit will be a bit sad (the upside being less washing up), the thought of not being able to sing at our ever popular carol services is a bit dispiriting, and no Christmas market and Ice Skating outside Winchester Cathedral is a bit of a downer. But maybe, just maybe, this Christmas – though different – could in its own way be rather wonderful.

Perhaps it might be a simpler and more holy Christmas rather than a season of generalized sentimental benevolence that is used to sell hard-pushed people stuff to give to other people who don't really want it? (Thanks to Rev Giles Fraser for that line.)

Perhaps it might be a Christmas of rediscovering the wonder at the heart of the familiar story of the creator of heaven and earth appearing in a humble guest room of a first century home, heaven having given up its King and the hope of the world invested in a helpless child rather than a Christmas of Slade and Mariah Carey and slightly awkward office parties. Perhaps this Christmas might be more ... well ... like Christmas?

Each year the Church of England runs a Christmas campaign. This year it centres on the theme of Comfort and Joy. Over the last nine months we have been reminded of our limited ability to control our own destiny and we've faced a stark reminder of our vulnerability. Many have faced loss, loneliness, hardship and fear.

Perhaps this year more than ever we need to reflect on the message at the centre of Christmas, the message that so easily gets lost amongst the trimmings and distractions of the season: that God is truly with us. And because of this most wonderful truth, Comfort and Joy can be found in even the most difficult of circumstances.

This Christmas may well be different, but it might be just what we need as we get ready to receive afresh the one who changes everything and speaks words of Comfort and Joy to us.

Speaking of Joy, it brought me untold amounts of the stuff to realise that Contagion Rules is an anagram of Nicola Sturgeon.

On that note, all that remains is for me to wish you all an Advent and Christmas full of Comfort and Joy...

A seating plan will be prepared, with the aim of maximising the available capacity. Please book before the **booking deadlines**, which are:

- the end of Tuesday 22nd December for the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services.

Holy Communion services on Christmas Day

For anyone wishing to attend a Holy Communion service on Christmas Day and not able to attend the Midnight Communion at Upton Grey, there is a 9.00am service at All Saints Odiham. Numbers are likely to be high, so early booking via nhdbchurchservices@gmail.com is advisable (please be sure to mention the December 25th 9.00am Odiham HC service in your email). There are also HC services at South Warnborough and in the United Parish, though numbers at those services may also be high – if you would like to know more about them please contact Nick Willmer (WillmerN@gmail.com or 07860 300888).

Face coverings

Please bring face coverings to every service - they are a legal requirement, the only exceptions being while leading a service or leading prayers or reading lessons, or consuming the bread at Holy Communion, or children under 11, or the standard exemptions for e.g. health or disability reasons.

Upton Grey Carol Service: 6.00pm Sunday 20th December

St Mary's Upton Grey is determined to foster a spirit of as much Comfort and Joy as possible by hosting a Carol Service which is as close to normal as circumstances allow. It won't be the same as in previous years - it will be in the Churchyard, and congregational singing is not permitted - but there will be a choir and well known carols and readings and we shall all make the best of it! You don't need to book, but please wear warm clothes, and bring your own mulled wine and mince pies - plus, if it looks like rain, some way of keeping dry!

Services online or telephone based

With some parishioners not in a position to attend church services, the streamed traditional Sunday service is continuing. It is available from 9.15am – search YouTube for 'North Hampshire Downs Churches'. (Please note that the time of the 'premiere' is now 9.15 rather than 9.00.)

In addition to streamed services, the Church of England has established 'Daily Hope', a telephone line offering music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England. The line, which is available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044, has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services in mind.

Private prayer

Many of the twelve North Hampshire Downs churches are available for private prayer and quiet reflection at some point during the week. In this group of four churches, **St Mary's Upton Grey** is open for private prayer from **10.00am to 5.00pm on Wednesdays and Sundays**. (St Mary's Herriard, All Saints Tunworth and St Lawrence Weston Patrick are not currently open for private prayer.)

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Police Report from PC Andy Reid

Dear Residents

I am pleased to report no major reported crime in the areas of this magazine, we are still however experiencing acts of criminal damage to crops, fences etc. by poachers and sadly local farmers have reported finding dead deer having died after being chased and killed by having dogs set on them. If anyone sees any vehicles out in the evenings on fields panning bright lights across them or up in the trees (they do this to shoot the pheasants roosting in the trees) please let me know. I do however wish to thank the many residents that take the time to report suspicious vehicles and incidents to me from the villages; this is excellent and provides me with a good knowledge of what criminals are visiting our area. Thank you and please continue to do so, it all helps.

Whilst we have had limited crime reported in the area of this magazine, in nearby Preston Candover we had two non-dwelling burglaries reported between 1.30am and 2.00am on Thursday October 22nd in Alresford Road. At one address several builders' tools were stolen, and in the other a red Husqvarna TE 511 motorcycle registration HX61 HLG.

In Chilton Candover overnight of November 8th/9th a Land Rover 90 Defender was stolen from outside a house in the village.

On October 18th between 1.30pm and 2.00pm, two garages were broken into at the rear of Southlea in Cliddesden. Also in Cliddesden on October 29th, in the early evening, two men were disturbed in a garden at a premise outside Cliddesden with torches; they ran off and got into a Honda CRV, which was later found burnt out in Henley-on-Thames. This is a good example of how far these people will travel in a day to commit crime. A van was broken into nearby during the same period.

Overnight of November 10th/11th poachers killed a pheasant with a catapult in Green Lane Ellisfield and caused damage to the field. I suspect these were the same who returned the following evening and were seen in Green Lane and later Bell Lane. I am aware that in Herriard a window was broken after a projectile was fired at a window by a catapult on the same evening. If anyone has any information that can assist, please let me know.

I have just received a call concerning residents walking around the edge of fields known as the headlands. Local farmers have put up fences etc. to indicate that the area must not be walked on, the reasons include

conservation issues, ground nesting birds etc. The landowners have asked if residents could please refrain from clambering over the fences onto the headlands, especially those in the field along the Bidden Road opposite Little Hoddington.

As we enter December may I again remind all residents to please be aware of home security and protecting your property, please use lighting and other security devices to protect your home. Please remain vigilant and report any crime that may happen to you, it is vital that the Police are aware of crimes in our area as it may be part of a much larger series and link in to other similar crimes.

May I conclude by taking this opportunity to wish you all and your families a very happy and safe Christmas period. Many thanks for your continued support which is most gratefully appreciated.

Farming News

With all the crops planted and either well established or just emerging we have done better than last Autumn despite the weather seeming to be a bit Deja vu. Instead of continuous steady rain, we have had extremely heavy dumps of rain with October being exceptionally wet. We measured the highest ever amount of rain to fall in a calendar month at Hyde Farm in October totalling to 219.5mm! With our average annual rainfall based on 800mm, we've had a quarter of our annual rainfall in a month. In comparison to October 2019, we only had 116mm.

This is why we are seeing more flooding around the Village with in particular Herriard Green seeing more flooding of late. The wettest block of fields we farm are ironically some of the highest fields on the farm, they are located behind Hyde Farm on Back Lane looking back down the hill towards Upton Grey. The fall on these fields and the topography means that rainfall run-off either heads down towards Upton Grey or back towards Herriard Green then towards Bagmore lane and eventually onto the Candover valley. No matter what farming technique you adopt, with such a large amount of rainfall there are always going to be issues with flooding and run-off. Our weather patterns seem to be at either end of the scale, from extreme wet periods to extreme dry, which bring their own challenges with farming.

With the newly planted crops emerging, our main job will be keeping an eye on Aphid numbers as they carry diseases that can infect the plants and will eventually kill them. This is where we miss the cold dry winters that would kill off the Aphids.

The grain stores are starting to be emptied, with grain being sold and moved off to the mills. Grain prices have held up well this year so far due to the weather from 2019/2020 affecting the national yields. 2020 has certainly been a year we won't forget; one consolation would be how much we all appreciate food on the shelves - or should I say toilet rolls! - with local stores and farm shops showing their worth now more than ever, keeping local communities supplied with food and essentials and the local pubs adapting by supplying takeaway meals and essentials as well.

With all the field work nearly done for the year, this is the time of year we wash all the kit and service to pack away ready for the spring. They say no two years are the same... so we will be looking forward to 2021 with promise.

Upton Grey & Beyond - fibre / superfast Broadband Update

Most people will have been updated via flyers or our local email circulation system, but to summarise:

- Openreach have completed their detailed survey and offered to provide free fibre connection to applicable (nearly all) houses in Upton Grey, Weston Patrick, Corbett and Mark and part of Tunworth.
- This is on the basis of sufficient residences pledging government support vouchers to them. Hopefully, we will achieve sufficient pledges from our residents.
- You can now pledge your vouchers
 - go to www.openreach.com/connectmycommunity.

- Once you have pledged, contact your area representative (for info go to the website below) and inform that person of the date you pledged.
- Note that you do not need to order a new fibre package until the fibre installation is completed next Autumn hopefully.
- The disruption caused by installing fibre should be minimal and nothing like the horrendous disruption caused by the sewage pipework currently being laid along Weston and Bidden roads.
- If things go according to plan there is a good chance that fibre will be fully installed by October 2021.

Upton Grey Parochial Church Council (PCC) needs a new Treasurer - Can you help?

Upton Grey PCC needs a volunteer to take over as our new Treasurer. You do not need to have served on the PCC, or even be a regular churchgoer: the main thing is to be willing to help maintain St Mary's Church as the centre of village activity. So, can you help?

Treasurer's role

The Treasurer does not need to be an accountant – it is more important that a potential Treasurer has enthusiasm and wants to do the job; indeed, the post of Treasurer is voluntary and is therefore unpaid. There will be a good handover from the previous treasurer that will cover most of what the new Treasurer will need to know and do. There will also be some training provided, and previous Treasurers will be on hand for advice and mentoring.

Skills and Characteristics Required

- Reasonable financial competence, the ability to use accounting software and spreadsheets, and an understanding of double entry bookkeeping.
- Have an understanding of the parish, its needs and challenges.
- Willingness to attend PCC meetings (4 per year, and the meetings usually last about 2 hours), not only to deal with financial matters, but also in order to be aware of the PCC's plans.
- Be able to explain financial issues clearly, both to the PCC and to the general church membership.
- Be able to maintain confidentiality, particularly with respect to matters that relate to individual church members, e.g. their personal giving.

• Meet the wider requirements of the Charity Commissioners for all trustees: i.e. not disqualified by bankruptcy or by convictions for financial wrongdoing.

Key Tasks for our Treasurer

• Weekly – about 2 hours per week

Bank cheques

Pay invoices

Update accounts in Finance Coordinator software

• Monthly – about 2 hours at the end of each month

Bank reconciliation

Check Parish Giving spreadsheet and Standing Order spreadsheet against receipts in bank

• Quarterly – about 2 hours per quarter

Claim Gift Aid for previous quarter

Gift Aid is claimed on standing order donations, donations through Sum Up, Safari Supper donations, and envelopes collected on a Sunday, plus any other donations through cheques etc.

• For PCC meetings (also quarterly) – about 2 hours to prepare

Prepare actual against budget spreadsheet and present report to meeting

Attend meetings (it may not be necessary to attend the whole meeting)

• Annually – about 6–8 hours at the end of the Financial Year

Prepare Annual Accounts for examiner

Prepare Treasurers Annual Report

Submit audited accounts to the Diocese

Prepare Annual budget

1. Regular, planned donations

Our preferred method of collecting regular donations is via the Parish Giving Scheme which uses direct debit. How the Scheme works is explained at parishgiving.org.uk.

To sign up for the Parish Giving Scheme, please either contact our Treasurer by email at treasureruptongreypcc@gmail.com for a form or register direct over the phone by calling 0333 002 1271 and quoting Upton Grey's parish reference number which is 410641133. You will need your bank account details to hand.

Please also contact the Treasurer for details if you would like to donate by bank standing order instead.

2. One-off donation: online or via QR code or BACS

To make a one-off donation online, please go to: www.uptongreychurch.co.uk/donate. Alternatively, you can click with a smart phone on the QR code displayed in the Church and opposite. Please follow the prompts and complete your details if you are a UK taxpayer so we can claim Gift Aid on your donation.



When you have completed the details once, using the same payment method the system will automatically assume Gift Aid is to be collected unless you click the Exclude Gift Aid button.

If you wish to arrange a BACS payment to our PCC bank account, please contact our Treasurer as above.

3. In Church

To make a cash or cheque donation, please use one of the white Gift Aid envelopes available in the pews and place it on the collection plate at the end of the service. Cheques should be made payable to Upton Grey Parochial Church Council. Our QR code is also displayed in the Church. Sometimes collections at a service are for a specific cause or charity supported by the Church.

4. Online Shopping

We've registered St Mary's Church Upton Grey with #easyfundraising, which means over 4,000 shops and sites will now donate to us for FREE every time you use #easyfundraising to shop with them. Herriard Garden Club

To keep you gardening all year round, if you haven't got Hellebores, otherwise known as Lenten roses, in your garden, order or buy some from garden centres to give you beautiful flowers in white and shades of pink and red from Christmas through to early spring. They're out when nothing much else is in bloom and are hardy and long lasting, making good cut flowers if you first sear the stem ends in boiling water for 30 seconds. They are better as cut flowers when the flower is mature, when a seed pod starts to form at the centre of the sepals. A source of food for pollinating insects in early spring, they are happy in light shade in moist but free draining soil. Remove old and damaged leaves in autumn. Mulch in spring to reduce drying out.

Jobs for December

- 1. Insulate outdoor taps and prevent ponds from freezing.
- 2. Prune acers, birches and vines before Christmas to avoid bleeding.
- 3. Prune open grown apples and pears.
- 4. Deciduous trees and shrubs can still be planted or transplanted.
- 5. Take hardwood cuttings.
- 6. Reduce watering of houseplants.

The RHS website is a good source of information for the amateur gardener on how to tackle some of these jobs correctly, with videos showing exactly what to do if you are unsure.

Recipe of the month

Leek, mushroom and goats cheese strudels - a low fat vegetarian recipe using up leeks as a light lunch or supper dish. Serve with a salad. Serves 4.

Ingredients

500g leeks thinly sliced

150ml vegetable stock

175g chestnut mushrooms, sliced

4 large sheets filo pastry

1 tbsp. olive oil

90g soft rinded goats' cheese

1 tsp poppy seeds

Method

- 1. Heat oven 200 C. Put leeks and stock into a large pan, cover and cook 5-8mins until starting to soften. Add the mushrooms, cover again, cook 3 mins then remove lid and continue to cook until the juices have evaporated. Tip onto a plate to cool.
- 2. For each strudel lightly brush half of each filo sheet with some olive oil. Fold the unbrushed side over to make a smaller sheet, two layers thick. Brush the edges with a little more oil. Spoon a quarter of the vegetable along one edge. Crumble a quarter of the cheese over then roll up to seal in the filling, like a sausage roll.
- 3. Put the strudels on a baking tray, brush with butter or oil and scatter over the poppy seeds. Bake for 25 mins until golden brown.

Odiham Voluntary Care Group: Stay Well this Winter

To help you stay well during the colder months, here are some tips, collated by Hart District Council from trusted sources.

- Stay warm. Heat your home to at least 18° C (65° F). If you can, make the room where you spend the most time slightly warmer. 'Hitting the cold spots' can help if you are struggling to keep your home warm. Telephone 0800 804 8601, Monday-Friday 9.00-5.00.
- Keep active. If able, try to get out for a daily brisk walk (make sure you dress appropriately for the conditions) or get active at home. More information at www.energiseme.org/getting-active.
- Eat and drink well to help keep you in good shape and fight off infections.
- With less sun in winter, Public Health England recommends taking a daily supplement containing 10 micrograms of vitamin D.
- You may feel down in winter. Try to keep to a routine, keep in touch with others, and do something you enjoy each day. If you've been

feeling down for a while, talk to your GP surgery. If you need someone to talk to at any time, day or night, you can telephone Samaritans 116 123, or if you are aged 55 and over you can also telephone The Silver Line 0800 4 70 80 90. More information at: www.hart.gov.uk/covid-19-health-wellbeing.

- This year it's more important than ever to get your flu vaccination. If eligible for a free vaccination, your GP practice will contact you to invite you for an appointment. You can also have one at your local pharmacy. See www.nhs.uk/conditions/vaccinations/flu-influenza-vaccine.
- Keep your medicine cabinet well stocked. Pharmacists can advise you what to include, as well as offering advice on a wide range of conditions and common illnesses. A simple guide may be found at: www.nhs.uk/live-well/healthy-body/your-medicine-cabinet/. Arrange any repeat prescriptions in good time, particularly ahead of the Christmas and New Year break.
