From the Benefice Ministry Team

As I write this, it is Day 16 of the invasion of Ukraine. Daily we see more and more distressing images of bombed hospitals, people displaced from their homes, children and adults brutally killed and injured, and already more than 2 million Ukrainian refugees fleeing the country to Poland and other European countries. As we look on, it is easy to feel helpless and powerless in the face of such suffering. However, there is one thing we can all do, and that is to pray.



But how might we pray? One of the most well-known prayers in the world, the Lord's Prayer, was taught by Jesus to his followers in the first century, and it's recorded in the Bible in Matthew's gospel:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins,
as we forgive those who sin against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from the evil one.

One of the most striking phrases, which is often overlooked, is this: "Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Jesus, the Son of God, included this potent request so that we might ask for something better on earth. And it also raises the question that is often asked – where is God in the midst of all this suffering? – a question that many are asking at the moment.

A recent initiative has been launched called 'Try Praying' (trypraying.co.uk), and the booklet they have produced helpfully explores this question of suffering like this:

"The phrase 'Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven' completely turns on its head a common misunderstanding: when things go wrong people blame God. When suffering occurs people often think it is God's will. But what Jesus said kicks that into touch. It

says God's will is often NOT being done! It's a mess and God is not happy with it. Bad stuff happens – really bad stuff.

This kind of language makes us realise things are not right. We live on a beautiful planet, but there are serious problems. It is occupied by a flawed human race. At times we all do appalling things that bring suffering to others. In addition, Jesus mentions circumstances and influences that test us and he says there is an 'evil one'. So instead of laying the blame for bad stuff at God's door we should put blame where it really belongs.

We are invited to pray for God's kingdom to come; something which will make life on earth better. We can ask that things here would change and for God's will to be done instead. God's ultimate purposes will be fulfilled, and he will right all wrongs. Not only that, but he is not uncaring as we face suffering, he is compassionate – which he showed so powerfully by coming amongst us in the person of Jesus and dying for us on the cross."

May I encourage us all to pray more and more? How about we all as a community commit ourselves to praying this, the Lord's Prayer, each day, as we lift up to God the people of Ukraine, and pray for peace in that land, and protection and healing for all concerned.

Please do also join us in our regular prayer vigils at All Saints Church, Odiham - and around the 12 churches in our local network (the benefice) - that we have recently started in response to this conflict. After one of these prayer vigils, someone remarked to me afterwards that they had felt in our midst a real sense of power – overcoming what they had previously felt of being powerless and helpless in the face of such suffering.

As St Paul said to the early Christian church in Thessalonika 'pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you'. Prayer is something we can all do, God tells us to do it, and it changes things!

It was a long evening, and we sorted through a lot of bags. We were all blown away by people's generosity, and it reminded me of a passage in the Bible where God is talking to Christians, and he says:



'For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

Police Report from PCSO Andy Jones

Reports continue throughout our area of people driving through hedges, over land and over crops, poaching and in pursuit of hares. This has caused considerable hardship to wildlife and damage to land and crops in our local area.

In Upton Grey deliberate damage was caused to a wing mirror of a car parked in a public area overnight.

There have been reports of individuals accessing gardens and helping themselves to property, particularly metal based items probably for use as scrap metal.

As energy prices increase there is likely to be, as in previous times, an increase in the theft of oil so please protect your oil and tanks. For advice on how best to do that and protect your property, please contact Andy Jones your local PCSO.

Farming News

Whilst 2022 has been jam packed with events across the globe so far this year already, on the farm it has been fairly quiet with a few odd jobs of hedge trimming and washing/servicing machinery ready for Spring work.

The weather at the end of January was a pleasant surprise and almost felt Spring like, also known as "fool's Spring". This was very tempting to venture out into the fields to either spread fertiliser or even plant some Spring crops. Especially when a couple of farming friends kept sending me pictures of them all busy out in the fields planting on their nice light and free-draining soil, whilst our heavier clay soil was still wet and cold which is not ideal for a newly planted seed to germinate in. I am now glad we haven't planted any crops, especially after the storms we got in February, which has blown over several big trees around the farm and the village. But as I write this the weather has now perked up again and has allowed us to apply the first dose of nitrogen fertiliser to the Autumn sown crops, and hopefully we shall have planted our Spring beans and barley by the middle of March.

The terrible events happening in Ukraine have affected everyone around the world and we are seeing unprecedented times, again... which is giving us some new issues to tackle in the farming world as well. As I

write this, fertiliser is at £900/Ton, red diesel is 120p/Litre and wheat is £300/Ton for feed quality. Milling (bread making) quality is actually at a discount to this! To put that into perspective, around this time last year wheat was £150/T for feed quality, fertiliser was £270/Ton and red diesel was 65p/Litre. So broadly everything has at least doubled if not tripled in price for us but with no way of knowing where it will end up. All we can do is try and grow our crops as efficiently as we can by making sure we are not excessively applying products or burning diesel unnecessarily.

Out in the fields, the autumn sown crops are looking well and are thankful for a fairly dry winter. Our annual rainfall surprisingly was back to average levels (800mm) even though it felt like a terrible Summer, we didn't get that much rain, it was just dull and cloudy. We are also planning to get the first dose of 'digestate' from the AD plant spread onto some of the crops by the end of March, providing an organic form of fertiliser.

The final crop we plan to plant this year will be the Maize, which will be planted in mid-April, weather permitting. We have a new cultivator this year specifically for maize establishment. This is called a 'strip-till system'. So, we will only cultivate the rows where the maize will be planted into, rather than cultivating the whole field. The idea of this is to maintain a healthy soil structure which will retain moisture but also preventing water logging. By not cultivating the whole field it will preserve worm numbers in the soil which provide vital drainage holes but also allow soil nutrients to be more mobile through the soil profile. At harvest time the soil structure should be firmer so will be able to prevent rutting from the forage harvester and the tractors and trailers meaning we will have a better chance of planting the wheat into the maize stubble this Autumn.

After spending the Winter months inside I'm looking forward to getting back in the tractor and out in the fields again. Will Cheyney

Superfast Fibre Broadband Update

Openreach are now forecasting completion of our Fibre Project as of end May – some 6 months later than their forecast last Autumn. With regard to the DCMS vouchers expiring they have no update yet, but I do not believe this will be an issue (famous last words!).

Educational Grants available to ALL Upton Grey Residents

The Upton Grey Educational Trust was formed when the Upton Grey School was sold after its closure in the 1980s and half of the proceeds were put into the Trust.

The Trust can use the income from the investment twice yearly "for the advancement of education".

The Trust meets in June and December each year to consider applications for assistance with educational needs, **from any age group and with no means testing**. Since the Trust was set up, it has awarded grants to nearly 100 applicants and 16 groups in addition to Long Sutton School.

Armed Forces Day Memorial Convoy for the Fallen

Official MoD Armed Forces Day event 25 June 2022

In June 2019 during the official commemorations for the 75th Anniversary of D-Day, a convoy of WW2 military vehicles travelled fifty miles through Hampshire and Berkshire.

The convoy travelled the route taken by General Eisenhower on the afternoon of 5 June 1944, hours before the launch of Operation Overlord, the Invasion of Occupied Europe. Eisenhower visited men of the 101st American Parachute Infantry Regiment, stationed at Greenham Common (USAAF base AF 486) who were to be among the first troops into enemy territory and who were likely to suffer heavy losses. He wanted to encourage the men and wish them good luck and 'God Speed.'

When the convoy arrived at the former WW2 airfield, the Act of Remembrance by British Military personnel was a parachute drop with a WW2 48-star American flag, returning the spirit of those who lost their lives during the D-Day Campaign. A representative of the United States Embassy planted a memorial tree.

Building on the experience of that convoy, the organisers have announced a special event to be presented on 25 June 2022 to coincide with Armed Forces Day. The Armed Forces Day Memorial Convoy, which will travel the shorter route of thirty-seven miles from Southwick House PO17 6EJ to Basingstoke RG22 6PG, is in memory of the Fallen of all Wars. It has been made possible with the considerable help and support of the event partners, Think Ford and Southern Coop and media partners Family Tree (Warner Group Publications).

The event is not only about Remembrance; it is also about looking to the future and the care and wellbeing of Veterans through fundraising for the Royal British Legion Riders Branch, members of which will be providing a motorcycle escort on the day of the convoy.

The convoy will leave Southwick at approximately 10.00am and will take the B2177 to Wickham, the A32 through the Meon Valley to the A31 at Alton. From Alton the convoy will exit via the B3349 en route to the former Lasham Airfield GU34 5SS for a short stopover. They will then take the A339 to Basingstoke arriving at approximately noon.

Communities along the route will be supporting the convoy as it passes, to include the ringing of church bells and official Salutes by Town Mayors and Dignitaries.

Vantage points will be advised in due time.

The convoy will be welcomed at a free-to-enter public event on the show field adjacent to the Milestones Living History Museum. The onsite event is open from 10.00am to 4.00pm, and during the afternoon a memorial plaque will be dedicated to the Fallen.

To reach the widest possible audience, two high-profile Hampshire-wide competitions are being organised by the sponsors from March until June. Both competitions will be history based and will focus on discovering more about ancestors who served in the Armed Forces.

A spokesperson for the voluntary organising team said that 'We hope this special event will encourage more people to discover their family history and to support the need for Remembrance especially on Armed Forces Day'. A special guest will be attending the Service before the start of the convoy and the guest will then start the convoy on its journey of Remembrance.

Ranil Jayawardena MP April Column

The situation in Ukraine continues to evolve, however the information in this article was correct as of 14th March 2022.

The volume of correspondence to me from local people shows how gravely concerning the events unfolding in Ukraine are. I have, of course, been raising constituents' urgent cases with Ministers, and HM Government is doing its utmost to offer more help as our brave friends defend their homeland.

Britain remains steadfast in her support for Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity. She did everything within her power to help Ukraine prepare; working for a number of years to support Ukraine's security and defence, training over 22,000 members of the Ukrainian army and helping Ukraine build and sustain a naval capability. Further, as Russia's behaviour became increasingly threatening recently, the Defence Secretary provided new security assistance to increase Ukraine's defensive capabilities, including the supplying of light, anti-armour, purely defensive weapon systems and a small number of British personnel to provide training for a short period of time.

Following the flagrant violation of both international law and Ukraine's territorial integrity, the Prime Minister announced the largest and most severe package of economic sanctions that Russia has ever seen, announcing asset freezes on more than 100 new entities and individuals, on top of hundreds previously announced. Amongst many other sanctions, this includes full asset freezes, excluding Russian banks from the British financial system and SWIFT, and banning the Russian state and private companies from raising funds or obtaining loans in the United Kingdom. HM Government has brought forward the Economic Crime Bill, whilst a new dedicated 'kleptocracy cell' in the National Crime Agency will target sanctions on Russian assets hidden in the United Kingdom.

As well as my work as your local Member of Parliament, I have been involved with this effort, as Minister for International Trade, making new trade restrictions and stringent export controls on 25th February. These are in addition to a new 'customs easement' to remove a number of customs formalities, to make the moving of aid and donations to the people of Ukraine easier.

You may be interested to know that the United Kingdom spends more on defence, in cash terms, than any NATO member other than the United States; and the Foreign Secretary has both outlined the need for NATO Allies to increase their financial commitments to the Alliance in response to the threat from Russia, and encouraged others to support Ukraine's defences, as the United Kingdom is doing. The United Kingdom is already Europe's largest contributor to NATO, leading the NATO Battlegroup in Estonia, and we have deployed more troops to NATO's Enhanced Forward Presence than any other Ally. The Ministry of Defence has put 1,000 more British personnel at readiness here at home to support a humanitarian response, if needed, too.

Turning to Ukrainian citizens escaping or displaced by Russia's advance, HM Government is playing its part. First, the expansive Ukrainian Family Scheme allows family members of British nationals, settled persons and certain others to come or stay in the United Kingdom. Those joining this free Scheme, which has no salary or language requirements, and no longer requires Ukrainians with passports to go to a Visa Application Centre to give their biometrics, will be granted leave for three years and be able to work and access public funds.

Second, the new humanitarian 'Local Sponsorship Scheme for Ukraine' pathway will open a route to the United Kingdom for Ukrainians who may not have family ties, but who are able to match with individuals, charities, businesses and community groups. There will be no limit on this scheme; individuals will be granted leave for an initial period of twelve months and will be able to work and access public services.

Third, Ukrainians already here can either extend their visa or switch to another immigration route, where eligible, even if their visa does not normally allow them to do so.

Be assured that the United Kingdom will continue to work with her allies to defend Ukraine's right to choose their own destiny, encourage deescalation in that part of the world and to hold Russia to account for the threatening, destabilising, and malign actions we have seen.

Soft Plastic Recycling

Tesco is now recycling soft plastics – a lot of the items we currently put into our grey bins, and which goes to landfill. Tesco store in Hook has a 'cage' just inside the doors on the exit where you can deposit bags full of soft plastic. This includes baby, pet food, detergent and cleaning pouches, biscuit and chocolate wrapping, bread bags, bubble wrap and cling film, cereal liners, cheese, fish and meat wrapping, crisp and sweet bags, delivery bags, frozen food bags, multi-pack wrapping, plastic carrier bags, plastic film lids, salad, pasta and rice bags, toiler roll wrapping. Obviously make sure it is all clean. Once you start collecting it is surprising how much you can collect/save in a week. April – 5000 trees and counting to mark our 40th Anniversary!

The u3a started in France in 1973 and it was mostly associated with a local university. However, when the concept reached the UK, in the early 1980's, it

evolved to become a self-help organisation, run by its members for its members, with a focus on enjoying different activities with like-minded people.

Today, the UK network comprises in excess of 1 000 groups right across the country; as of January 2020, total membership exceeded 450 000. Each u3a is formally structured as an independent self-financing and self-managing charity with links to the Third Age Trust, which acts as a national coordinating body.

This year is our 40th Anniversary and the goal was to plant 5,000 trees to form a new wood in the Brecon Beacons. However, once the planting season got underway last November it took members just three months to exceed the target - part of the u3a movement's contribution to nature and the environment. Now the u3a has expanded its ambition and hopes to plant 10,000 trees by the end of 2022 and our Climate Change group is joining in!

The Third Age Trust publishes a national magazine. Third Age Matters and two of our Climate Change group have articles published in the last edition. Jim Osgerby shares some of the ways he has gradually made positive changes to reduce energy consumption at home and cuts his fuel bill by 25% and Clive Teague considers the actions and impact of Extinction Rebellion.





The Evolving story of the Exploitation and Utilisation of Wood!

It is hard to believe that, in antiquity, vast forests were growing in the Middle East, the mountain slopes of this region were covered with massive cedar forests. The destruction of the cedar forests of the Middle East is told in the oldest known surviving written story in the world: *The epic of Gilgamesh* was written in Mesopotamia between the Tigris and Euphrates rivers around 3,000 BC. The second episode of the epic is known as "The Forest Journey" and is the story of deforestation in the Middle East.



The forests were the resource for the construction of temples and palaces in the kingdoms and empires. Their rulers undertook massive building programmes to display their power and wealth. In doing so they needed large amounts of, mainly cedar, wood.

The story of Gilgamesh is the story of the ruler of the citystate of Uruk. Gilgamesh wished to make for himself "a name that endures" by building "walls, a great rampart and the temple of

blessed Eanna". To realise his ambitious construction he needed large amounts of timber, and the natural forests of Mesopotamia remained almost untouched at that time. But it was not an easy task for Gilgamesh to enter the forests and cut down the trees. The cedar forests were the gardens of the Mesopotamian gods and were protected against human beings' need for timber by a guard named Humbaba appointed by the chief Sumerian deity.

But Gilgamesh was determined to get his hands on the timber and went "to the land where the cedar is felled". When Gilgamesh and his companions arrived at the forests a fight with the formidable god for control over the forests followed. After a heavy struggle Humbaba was killed by Gilgamesh "There then followed confusion; for this was the guardian of the forest whom they had struck down: he at whose words Hermon and Lebanon were used to tremble. Now the mountains were moved, the ranges of the hills were moved, for the guardian of the cedar lay dead".

Gilgamesh and Enkidu cut down the cedar forest and in particular the tallest of the cedar trees to make a great cedar gate for the city of Uruk. They built a raft out of the cedar and floated down the Euphrates River to

the city. The author of the epic knew that once humans started to exploit the forests, nothing could stop them from cutting down all the trees.

The fate of the cedar forests was sealed. The Phoenicians, one of the oldest sea-trading nations in the world, needed timbers for their ships and used the cedars of Lebanon to construct them. Writers such as Homer, Pliny, and Plato, along with the Old Testament, provide us with well-documented descriptions of the once richly forested mountains of Lebanon. The Bible also vividly describes the practice of rulers in the Ancient Middle East to fell cedar trees to build massive monuments. The account of the construction of the first temple in Jerusalem tells us that king Solomon sends a message to the king of Tyre with the request to provide him with timber: 1 Kings 5: 6 - 10 "Now therefore command thou that they hew me cedar trees out of Lebanon". What follows is a detailed account of how the trees were taken down from the mountains of the Lebanon and floated in rafts by the sea to Israel.

All these stories, myths and histories from the ancient world confirm that the people were exploiting the forest resources! For example, Woodhenge: A Neolithic timber monument built around 2500 BC, about the same time as Stonehenge, and only 2 miles away to the north-east, it is formed of six concentric ovals of tall wooden posts, surrounded by a bank and ditch, which were built to align with sunrise at the summer solstice. The site was discovered in 1925 and excavated in 1926–7 by Ben and Maud Cunnington, who marked the positions of the wooden posts with concrete pillars for visitors. As we begin to notice the effects of man-made climate change, we might take a moment to appreciate just how consistently man has exploited the natural resources of our planet and how change must come! This is an ongoing story.

Seagrass: The Solent's superhero - Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust

Beneath the waves of the Solent are hidden underwater gardens of seagrass. These marine flowering plants are known for increasing biodiversity in our coastal waters. However, they are now beginning to gain widespread recognition for their potential to reduce the effects of

climate change and what better time to celebrate this superstar marine plant than during Seagrass Awareness Month, which spans all of March.

Seagrasses typically occur along shallow, sheltered marine coastlines and estuaries, from the Tropics to the Arctic Circle. They have roots, grass-like leaves and produce flowers and seeds. Under the right conditions, these plants can grow to form flourishing, green underwater meadows which provide food and shelter for an array of wonderful marine life.

They support rich biodiversity, including amazing species such as sea anemones, stalked jellyfish, sea slugs, pipefish and seahorses. They act as nurseries for commercially important fish species, such as cod and sea bass, the latter of which spend up to seven years growing in the Solent before joining the migratory adult population. Cuttlefish visit the seagrass meadows to breed as well, attaching their black eggs known as 'sea grapes' to the seagrass leaves. Seagrass also provides a major food source for brent geese, which make the 3000-mile journey from Siberia to the Solent every year for a milder winter.

Seagrasses are incredibly important allies in the fight against climate change. They absorb massive amounts of carbon dioxide from the surrounding seawater and their long leaves slow the flow of water, which encourages settlement of carbon-rich sediment down into the seabed where it is then buried and locked away. This amazing plant also improves our water quality and protects our shores from coastal erosion by slowing wave energy with their leaves and by stabilising soft seabed sediments with their roots.

Sadly, seagrass is disappearing. We've lost over 90% of our seagrass meadows in the UK over the past century. Disease, physical disturbance from dragging anchors and chain moorings, as well as human-induced threats such as pollution are putting seagrass under significant pressure.

At Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust, we're working to protect and restore our seagrass meadows. By monitoring and surveying existing seagrass beds and planting sustainably collected seagrass seeds, we hope to restore these amazing habitats towards their historic levels and create a wilder Solent, for both people and wildlife.
