

Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

I don't know if you feel the same as me, but I always appreciate the changing of the seasons. As the colours change, as the leaves disappear and regrow, as new animals, birds and plant life appears, there is always something new to enjoy. Those days where you start wrapped up in coats and scarves and end in t-shirts are sometimes unpredictable, but speak to the changes around us.



Sometimes though, this can feel a direct contrast to our own personal experience of the rest of life. It can feel like everything is changing but us. That the last few weeks and months have felt an awful lot like the ones preceding it. Perhaps we enjoy the consistency and stability, or maybe we find it frustrating or difficult. I personally find myself feeling both comfort and disquiet. On the one hand, the familiarity of the rhythms and patterns of life create a predictability that you can rest in. However, as a natural-born fidgeter, I find myself looking for what might be new and different. And that's why I love the changes of the seasons.

Whatever we feel, wherever we are, whoever we are... the seasons will change. Summer dissolves into Autumn, wilting away into Winter before Spring again breaks forth into the heat of Summer once more. The cycle is both consistently dependable yet always new.

Perhaps this can point us to something higher. Someone higher. We're told that God is the same yesterday, today and forever. He never changes, he is dependable, he is good and true. And yet his mercies are new every day, there is always something more to learn or experience.

I wonder if you'd like to reflect over this Autumn on the consistency and change of life. Perhaps carve out a little intentional time to dwell on life. If you're feeling that things are a little chaotic and unpredictable, take it to the God who is dependable and constant. Allow him to provide the stability you need at this time. But if you're feeling that too much is the same it's always been, perhaps ask God to speak of his plans and purposes, to show you that there is always something new

in store for our everyday. Life with God is an exciting journey, and one I would invite everyone to explore.

I wonder if you have any favourite memories? These memories might be happy, scary, sad or exciting. They might be your favourite day out, a particular present or people you have met... Because I'm so old, I have loads! Maybe my favourite was the day I met my absolute hero – Desmond Tutu. If you've never heard of him, Google him now. He was a South African Bishop who spent his life fighting injustice in his homeland. One day, way back in 1997, I went to a very early church service and he gave me communion. I'm not sure anything will ever be more special! I wonder what your favourite memory is...

It's really important to remember things that have happened. As we get older, memories become more and more special – especially if it's of people you don't see any more... Let's play a game! Mr George and many like him who have been involved in wars have shown great bravery and resourcefulness. Yet despite the difficult things that they have experienced, they can still be positive and cheerful. I wonder if you will ever see cabbage sitting on your plate in the same way again! Some people, however, find it difficult to adjust to everyday life because of their experiences. The days that we remember can affect each of us in different ways.

In the week around 11th November we will be remembering others who have fought and are fighting in wars in different parts of the world. I wonder how you will remember them... Will you wear a poppy, march in a parade, keep a minute's silence?



These soldiers are often risking their lives to bring peace to our world, giving up everything so we can live in a peaceful country. But God calls us **all** to be peacemakers – in the Bible, it even says 'Blessed are the peacemakers'. I wonder – how can you be a peacemaker today? Maybe see you at one of the Remembrance Services on 12th November!

November Farming News

I'm currently wading my way through the many piles of paperwork and unanswered emails that have amassed in my office. In fact, I've had to move to the dining room table as there's no room to work at my desk anymore. Sorry Claire! We've been flat out making the most of the late September / early October Indian summer with maize harvest, wheat planting and slurry spreading in this year's rare dry conditions. I feel like we're finally on top of all the field work for the first time since early Spring.

What a year it has been, the complete opposite to last. Whereas last year was extremely dry, which resulted in a very enjoyable stress free wheat harvest and straw baling but very limited grass growth and poor maize yields for the cows' feed, this year has been a real struggle to make decent dry grass silage because of the wet and cold spring which also made maize planting difficult. Wheat harvest and straw baling was incredibly stop-start and expensive because of the rain. On 20th and 21st September Dad measured 39mm and 21mm of rain, that's over 2 inches in 24 hours. On the plus side, grass growth throughout the year has been phenomenal and maize yields from our recently harvested crop have been some of the best ever. This was much needed as we had to replenish our depleted feed stocks after last year's poor yields.

Our heifers and dry cows (the cows on holiday before they calve) that are out in the fields have had plenty of lush grass to eat throughout the grazing season and, providing it doesn't get too wet, we should be able to keep these out until winter, housing them in December. The young calves that are in the barns already have had to get used to the changing daylight hours. When feeding them early the other day it was the first time I'd had to turn the lights on in the barn because of the darker mornings. These calves are three months old and have never seen

an electric light before and thought it was great fun, if somewhat confusing, chasing their own shadows around.

I've just been out to see the builders who are finishing off a replacement barn to house our bulling heifers and dry cows. The old sheds that were there were wooden army huts that Dad and Grandpa put up in the late 1950's / early 1960's. Dad sold straw down to Dorset, and then dismantled Dorchester army barracks (he did ask, they were selling them off!) and loaded them onto the empty lorries for the return journey. They then erected them back here at the farm and adapted them for cow housing. Their second life as cow sheds had lasted a very respectable 60 years, but they were beginning to look like the ship of Theseus in which most of the original parts had been replaced and they had developed a rather worrying lean. The new barn will provide the cows with a much nicer environment, with one robot pushing up the feed and another robot ambling its way around the cows inside vacuuming up the poo.

So, with the rain lashing down, I'll head back to the office to try and dismantle another stack of emails before I start feeling like Mickey Mouse in the Sorcerer's Apprentice getting drowned not by brooms carrying water buckets but by the endless red tape. **Joe Ives**

St Mary's Upton Grey and St Michael's Basingstoke Ringing Outing - October 2023

History took place in St Mary's Upton Grey ringers' land as the first ringing outing for at least 40 years (according to Michael Church who must have surely only been in his teens for the last ringing outing ...) took place.



An intrepid band of ten ringers, from both St Mary's Upton Grey and also St Michael's Basingstoke wended their way to St Catherine's Wolverton. Once we arrived we all happily rang for the local woolly residents (sheep) for 45 minutes in a brick-clad tower that was built around a very

old wooden bell frame.

From there the planning went marginally awry as we arrived somewhat early by 30 minutes to St Lawrence Church, Wootton St Lawrence, but it was all fine as it was a gorgeous day and there was plenty of locally made jam, marmalade and honey to buy in the church as well as a stunning etched window by Whistler to admire before we finally got ringing.

On to lunch at The Barley Mow, Oakley, and once some very good fish and chips had been eaten we then inadvertently split up – some going to All Saints, Monk Sherborne, and others (who WILL remain nameless) went to St Andrews, Sherborne St John, due (honestly guv) to a Google Maps error... All Saints has five bells that are in the 'wrong order' – i.e. the order is anti-clockwise instead of the more usual clockwise order of the bells, so our brains were immediately tested but yielded pretty good results.

Moving onto St Andrews – or some of us re-visiting St Andrews, Sherborne St John – once we climbed the very steep ladder, through the hatch we were then in a snug ringing room with a very handy peep window to the church, that must be incredibly useful for spotting brides arriving. The intrepid band was beginning to flag a little at this point – having all been gently encouraged to improve our ringing over the course of the day by our leader for the tour, Pete.

Finally, we arrived at our final tower, St John's, Mortimer, which has an even more snug ringing chamber, but kept in immaculate order

and we rang out for the final 45 minutes to the footballers on the Common and sundry passers-by.

Many thanks, as well as Pete, to Giles, Lynne and Greg for running a tower each.

Everyone had a challenging – be it in ringing terms or navigating the lanes – and thoroughly enjoyable day and it will be an event that we won't wait for another 40 years to repeat – next year we hope to have our newbie ringers join us!

Educational Grants available to ALL Upton Grey Residents

The Upton Grey Educational Trust was formed when the Upton Grey School was sold after its closure in the 1980s and half of the proceeds were put into a Trust.

The Trust can use the income from the investment twice yearly “for the advancement of education”. The Trust meets in June and December each year to consider applications for assistance with educational needs, **from any age group and with no means testing**. Since the Trust was set up, it has awarded grants to over 100 applicants and 16 groups in addition to Long Sutton School.

News from the Hospital

(The Hampshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust includes hospitals in Andover, Basingstoke and Winchester)

The Lucy Letby case has hit national headlines and must be a real concern for prospective parents locally: could this be repeated in our own hospital? It is reassuring to note that not only is the mortality level regularly reviewed, in fact each death case is reviewed, but the Trust has in place arrangements to prevent a similar situation happening here. In addition, the Trust is ensuring all staff are able to speak up, however junior they might be, which was a major factor in the Letby case.

Patient safety and care is a top priority for the Trust, and whilst it may not be helpful for those admitted for urgent treatment, the Trust will shortly be adding a YouTube video to its website which will be of real value to those being admitted for elective procedures. This video covers a wide range of issues, including making sure one understands what is being said by staff, preventing side effects, such as falls or blood clots and infections, to being willing to ask for help when needed. At the same time the Trust is working hard to instil a patient caring culture in all staff, and as the citations for many of the 'Wow' awards confirm (awards to staff for going well beyond normal expectations), we have some amazing examples of this.

By now most people are aware that a new hospital is planned locally with public consultation anticipated in the near future. Lord Markham, Parliament Under Secretary for Health and Social Care, recently visited Basingstoke to help understand the need for change. He met with both staff and patient representatives and was able to give the assurance that as the plan for a rolling renewal of hospitals across the country had been developed with wide cross-party involvement in Westminster, any change of government would be unlikely to affect the programme.

He went on to explain that the planned construction methodology was to undertake considerable work off site, using a bring-to-site ‘pod’ system. Not only did he highlight the benefits this gives to future flexibility of layout as healthcare needs change over the years, but this method also gains from better cost control, faster construction and cost savings from standardisation, as well as protection from programme delays from adverse weather. He further emphasised that by spreading the programme over a long period, for example about 20 years, this would enable suppliers to invest appropriately with further productivity gains. He stressed that based upon benefits now achieved by Trusts with new hospitals, full digitisation of patient information was already improving productivity.

It is now widely recognised that the NHS is in crisis, its current budget is nearly one third of all the money the Government collects from us in taxation, and many don’t see additional funds as making any improvements. With many now opting to go private, whilst there is real concern that public health provision will decline, it shows that those better off are prepared to spend more on their health. For example:

- Does the NHS need radical surgery? For example, do we in this country need to move more to the continental system with nominal charges for its use – clearly with some mitigation for those less well off?
- Does it need to be split into more manageable units?
- How do we fix primary care where each GP surgery is a private business, because to become a partner, capital is required to purchase a share – not something young doctors with high student loans have in abundance?

As mentioned above, it is planned that the public consultation for the new hospital will start shortly. Whilst there will be some negative comments on the options, the Trust will really appreciate positive suggestions on how the options might be improved. It is however hoped

that many more people engage in the consultation than the under 300 people who participated in recent governor elections which covered a population approaching 200,000!

Likewise, the election of governors will be taking place starting at the end of October. Governors represent patient interests to the hospital management, so this is a vital role. Why not become a Trust member? This not only entitles you to vote, but it will also give you more up to date information and help you to play a part at this critical time. Hampshire and IoW wildlife Trust – Mammal mysteries

Mammals are all around us, from mice to voles to deer and foxes. From Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust nature reserves to parks, and our gardens. But how often do you see them? Most mammals like to stay hidden, and they're very good at it.

However, even the stealthiest species leave clues. Look around and you'll see tell-tale signs of these animals' hidden presence. Some are obvious, like large piles of droppings, and others more subtle, like nibbled pinecones. One of the most exciting things to find are footprints.

Foxes have four toes, and their footprint forms a neat diamond with a triangular foot pad, toes around the sides and front, and two claws forming a point at the front. Their droppings are also dog-like in shape, usually pointy at one end, and full of fur, feathers, tiny bones, seeds and berries.

Badger feet have five toes, and their prints show a wide, squarish foot pad with five toes at the front with long claws (for digging). Prints are very robust and broad (6.5cm wide). Their front and back paws differ slightly: the front-paw marks have longer claw marks, while the back-paw marks show the inner toes to be a little further forward. Badgers follow the same routes when they're foraging, so leave well-worn trails across fields or exiting woods and hedges or along fences. They poo in shallow pits called latrines, and their droppings vary from firm and sausage-shaped, to soft and slimy.

Though there are several species of **deer**, their tracks are roughly the same shape, just different sizes. Muntjac tracks are around 3cm long, whilst red deer tracks are up to 9cm long. Deer walk on tiptoes, so you only usually see two long pointed toe prints side-by-side, with no claws or foot pad. Deer droppings are smooth, shiny dark pellets; pointed at one end and often stuck together in clusters.

Rabbit prints are oval-shaped, and their four feet form a triangle – you won't really notice separate paw marks. It's often easier to find rabbits by looking for their little round pellet droppings on lawns and fields.

As a nation of pet lovers, there are millions of cats and dogs prints around so telling them apart from wildlife prints is key. Although dogs vary wildly in size, their prints are often around 3-5cm wide with four toes and big claw marks. Cat prints are generally 2-3cm wide and have no claw marks.


