### **Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team**

2023 was a particularly difficult year for the world. Using the words of Queen Elizabeth II from 1992 and of Kofi Annan in 2004, it was very much an *annus horribilis*. Not least because of humankind's inhumanity to each other. Month after month the news media were full of brutal images of fighting, killing and war. Whether it was in Israel and Gaza, or Ukraine. This is not to mention Central Africa, Iraq, Libya, Nigeria, Pakistan, Somalia or Sudan. The list seems endless.



Often it feels as though the world is going in exactly the wrong direction. We want to love and be loved and yet we so often hate. We want to share the possessions we have and yet we hoard things to ourselves. We want peace and yet we make war. We want a better world but do nothing about it.

The New Testament Greek word *metanoia* means exactly that, to turn around and go in the opposite direction. It also points to a complete change of heart and mind. It is used 58 times in the New Testament, so it is a very important idea.

We all long for 2024 to be an *annus mirabilis* – a wonderful year – a year of miracles. That's what we mean when we wish each other 'A Happy New Year'.

John Donne's poem 'No one is an island' reminds us that the whole of humanity is connected to each other. Actions large and small in other parts of the world impact on me here in North Hampshire, whether I realise it or not. Likewise my own actions, large and small, ripple out into the wider world. If the world needs to change so do I. If I want the world to change I need to change first.

The *metanoia* of the world begins with me. Half-hearted New Year Resolutions won't do it. I need to turn round, to have a complete change of heart and mind. St Paul in his letter to the Romans knew all about this struggle to change. 'I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do, I do not do, but what I hate I do' (Romans 7:15). Somehow each one of

us needs a miracle on the inside to help us become the people we were made to be.

The wonderful Christmas carol 'O Little Town of Bethlehem' describes this miracle perfectly and even offers us a prayer to use:

How silently, how silently, The wondrous gift is given; So God imparts to human hearts The blessings of His Heaven.

No ear may hear His coming,
But in this world of sin,
Where meek souls will receive Him still,
The dear Christ enters in.

O holy Child of Bethlehem, Descend to us, we pray! Cast out our sin and enter in, Be born in us to-day.

The miracle of Christmas is to let the Christ child enter in and to be born in our hearts to give us the new start we so need. It's a miracle not just for Christmas but for the New Year too. A miracle that begins with individuals but which offers hope for the whole world.

Wishing you a very happy annus mirabilis for 2024.

# **Farming news**

It's wet mid-December and I'm sitting in the warm, dry cab of the JCB, listening to Radio 5 live on a Saturday afternoon as yet another League Two football match is cancelled because of a waterlogged pitch. Five matches in total. We managed to keep 40 in-calf heifers out in the fields until 6th December by which time they had eaten all the good grass and were beginning to poach the ground, so they had to finally come into the barns. With all the wet weather we've had, we were fortunate to keep them outside that long. They were very pleased to come in as they had spent the previous week looking over the fence into the new barn at their cohorts tucked up warm and dry making their very noisy, discontented feelings heard for anyone who would listen. It has been such a wet difficult year.

So, all the cows, heifers and calves are in the barns for the winter. Our 250 milking cows are fed every morning by Simon using a tractor and mixer wagon. He uses the JCB to load the mixer wagon with a predetermined blend of grass silage, maize silage, straw and other goodies like oilseed rape meal and minerals. This giant blender then mixes the exact amount of ingredients, not too little and not too much so it's over processed. We want the mix just right so that every mouthful a cow has over the course of the next 24 hours consists of the same ingredients. Basically, so she cannot 'sort' the food. The ration is worked out by Vicky, our nutritionist, depending on how our grass silage and maize silage has analysed. In 2023 the silage yields were good, but quality was not because of the lack of sunshine. So generally, energy, protein and sugar levels were below usual values. This unfortunately means we have to buy in more 'straights' (other feeds) to compensate for the shortfall. For example, we are now adding cane molasses to the mix every day to up the sugar level of the ration because of the low levels in the silage. We are trying to produce as much milk from home produced feed as we can so buying in extra feed adds cost to the ration. We did have a glimmer of hope on the low milk price we're receiving at the moment though, an additional 1€cent/litre for December milk. So about 89pence/litre. We are still selling milk at below its cost of production but at last the milk price is very slowly heading in the right direction.

We have about 30 calves to feed with milk twice a day at any one time and an additional 230 weaned youngstock to feed and bed up every day so the winter months are very routine but very busy. Between Sally, Ric, Craig, Simon, Philip and myself we manage to get it all done, some days are longer than others though! The mechanisation certainly helps, with robots milking the cows and pushing the feed up and a robot in the new barn sucking up the cow dung and depositing it in the slurry lagoon. But it's the hard work and dedication of our team that is by far the most important ingredient in our farm mix. That cannot be understated.

Wishing them and you all a very happy 2024 with the perfect

Finally, as many of you are already aware, I am leaving Long Sutton C of E Primary School at the end of December 2023. It has not been an easy decision to leave such a wonderful school but the time has come to move on and seek new professional opportunities. It has been a privilege and a joy to lead the school and get to know so many of you from our three catchment villages of Long Sutton, South Warnborough and Upton Grey, and beyond. The village school is in a great place and the first class staff team will continue to serve the children, families and wider community with love, courage and hope as they move onto a new chapter. # Swifts - spectacular visitors that need our help

The skies of our parishes are now quiet. Nearly all the Swifts that hurtle overhead in early summer, thrilling and exhilarating us with their speed and screams, leave the UK in early August. It will be May before they return from Africa.

Swifts are supreme flyers, perfectly adapted to a life in the air. They sleep, feed and mate on the wing. They only land to breed. When a Swift chick fledges, it will spend the next three to four years in



constant flight. Swifts do not land on the ground or perch on buildings, trees or cables. They have short legs and small feet with sharp claws that are perfect for clinging to vertical surfaces, but unsuitable for perching.

Swifts eat flying insects. These insects are most numerous between May and August. That determines how long Swifts can spend in the UK as they need huge numbers of these insects to feed their chicks. Unlike Swallows and House Martins which can have two or three broods of chicks during the summer, Swifts have just a single brood of usually two young.

2000 years ago, Swifts nested in holes in trees or in cliffs. Now that is rare. Swifts are entirely dependent on buildings for nest sites. They look for small gaps high up where they can access a flat space to nest, such as under tiles or eaves. The nest is invisible from outside. Modern building techniques mean that houses built in the last 30 or so years rarely have any gaps, so most Swifts nest in older buildings. Thousands of nest sites are lost each year when buildings are demolished, or renovated, or when plastic soffits and fascias are installed. Swifts are faithful to their nest site, so once a pair find a site, they will return to it every year. If they return and find their nest site has been destroyed or is inaccessible, they may not breed that year unless a new nest site is available nearby.

Swifts are in catastrophic decline. In 27 years from 1994 their population has declined by 62% in the UK and by 70% in the South East, including Hampshire. Loss of nest sites is the overwhelming major factor. House Sparrows and Starlings are also experiencing steep declines. They too rely on buildings for nest sites.

Preserving existing nest sites and providing new nest sites is crucial to reverse the decline of Swifts in the UK. Thousands of new nest sites are needed to halt the decline. Hampshire Swifts is a charity set up in 2016 with the aim of stopping the downward trend of this special bird

and increasing their numbers. We give advice on all matters related to Swifts. We supply and install swift boxes - £40 for a single box, £75 for a double box. We advise on creating permanent homes for Swifts using Swift bricks. We work to persuade local councils and developers to help Swifts by installing Swift bricks in new homes at an average rate of one per dwelling.

How can *you* help Swifts? Preserve existing nest sites, put up nest boxes, encourage your neighbours to put up nest boxes, record where they are nesting on the Hampshire Swifts survey website (<a href="https://www.hampshireswifts.co.uk/swift-survey">https://www.hampshireswifts.co.uk/swift-survey</a>), and write to your local councilors about the importance of making the installation of Swift bricks in new developments a condition of planning approval.

Swifts are amazing and beautiful birds. The sound and sight of them racing, screaming over our rooftops is exhilarating and an essential part of summer. Let's make sure that continues.

# Fresh start - Is there something you just can't stop doing, even though you want to?

Why not try a course called Fresh Start, which is designed to help you tackle a life-controlling habit such as smoking, gambling, over-eating, internet addiction, shopping compulsions, binge drinking, soft drugs, etc – in fact any habit which once might have brought you comfort or fun but is now spoiling your daily living.

Fresh Start is a 9-week course run by Harvest Church, Alton. It's based on principles from the Bible and the 12-steps-of-recovery process, backed by 1-to-1 coaching and a support group of others wanting to tackle their habits. And it's free and completely confidential. I am now happier and am getting my priorities right ... I can never say THANK YOU enough times as I never thought I could beat this addiction'. A woman now in recovery from alcohol addiction said 'I wouldn't be where I am today if I hadn't come on Fresh Start'.

Hampshire and IoW Wildlife Trust – Winter sleepers – the hibernating habits of European Hedgehogs, Bats and Hazel Dormice As the temperature drops for winter you may have observed a change in local wildlife as species adapt to cope with the colder weather. Some species will avoid the unfavourable conditions through migration and others grow thicker winter coats, but a handful of Britain's wildlife will tough out the cold weather through hibernation.

Hibernation is a process of a prolonged period of inactivity that allows animals to survive when food is scarce, and the weather is harsh. To prepare for hibernation animals will build up a reserve of body fat by eating as much as possible in the lead up to winter, before retreating to somewhere safe where they will enter a torpid state. Once settled, almost all of the animal's bodily functions will either completely stop or slow down significantly, the body temperature will cool, and breathing and heart rate will slow down. For example, a bat's heartrate will slow to an astonishing four beats per minute but can reach 1,000 bpm when flying. This reduces the amount of energy its body must burn to survive.

There are only three UK mammals that truly hibernate: bats, Hazel dormice and European hedgehogs.

Dormice and hedgehogs hibernate right through the winter by developing enough brown body fat (fat reserves they can utilize during prolonged periods of sleep), which they build up by eating fat and sugarrich foods. In some cases, they can increase their own body weight by over 30%.

As omnivores (an animal which eats both plant and animals) hedgehogs are not picky eaters. These iconic creatures will feast on anything from fruit and insects to beetles and frogs and will reach a weight of 500-700 grams. Hedgehogs are also not fussy when deciding where they will overwinter. Some will build their own nest from dead leaves and twigs, whilst others will happily take shelter under a pile of logs, your compost heap or under a garden shed. Be careful when moving piles of leaves or wood over the winter as there may be a hibernating hedgehog underneath.

In the woodlands, dormice will gorge on a menu of nuts, seeds and berries, building up vital energy reserves. Dormice construct insulated nests hidden in hedgerows and thickets, where they retreat for hibernation.

During autumn, bats are especially active in hunting and finding a place to overwinter. Bats are unable to dig or build their shelters so have to look for the right spot. They like to roost in veteran trees that are hollow as well as man-made structures. You might find them wedged into holes in an old brick wall or in the roof of your house, but old barns and abandoned buildings are also favoured spots.
