Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

In our national life and public discourse we have become used to a growing fragmentation. We hear a multiplicity of competing voices all calling for their own preferment or privilege, often over and against anyone who would dare to disagree with them. Finding common ground for discussion it seems has become more and more difficult as notions of community, or 'being in it together' are



increasingly undermined. I think it is true to say that in a small village community such as ours this is far less pronounced than in the larger communities of towns and cities, but still, prevailing culture has an impact on us, even if relatively minor.

I suggest we need to rediscover the first person plural, or the 'we', if we are to live well with one another, both our immediate neighbours and the other citizens with whom we share this island. In this we might look at the family, however constituted, as an example of the importance of the 'we'. In a well-functioning extended family there will be numerous opinions, conflicting ideas and even factions. But in this happy and well-functioning family there is a shared investment in staying together as a unit, looking out for and loving one another. At the heart of this commitment lies the belief that there is something more important than each individuals own opinion or desires – that something is the family, the collection of relationships whose welfare and future they are all equally invested in.

Of course a simple abstraction from the level of the family to our national life is impossible – the bonds that connect parents and children, siblings, grandparents etc are different to the bonds that connect strangers who by a twist of fate happen to co-exist on the same piece of land at the same time. But, there are some lessons to be learned from the domestic sphere that might improve the quality of our national life.

The collective life of our nation needs to rediscover this sense of 'we' – we need a resurgence of the first person plural to allow us to navigate disagreements, come to shared understanding, and live well side-by-side as we belong together in a shared home. I would go so far

as to say that a rediscovery of this sense of 'we' is essential for the future flourishing of our nation.

In the record of the Gospels Jesus says relatively little about how his followers are to relate to the nations in which they lived, short of a couple of well-known pronouncements about living peaceably under authority and giving dues to those who claimed them - memorably Caesar when it comes to cash. Contra to some more radical interpretations of Jesus's teaching, he seemed to have no desire for his followers to be the cause of huge political upheaval – instead it seems he encouraged them to belong fully to the communities of which they were a part and to live peacefully under the systems which governed their lives. This it seems was due not to lack of interest in the politics and structures of the day, but because it was in the midst of these structures and communities (however temporary) that the kingdom of God would be revealed in the lives of those who professed to follow him.

You see one of the great callings of the church is to be a demonstration of the importance of the first person plural in the name of Jesus. To be a community of 'we' in which individuals of all ages, backgrounds, experiences and preferences can find a sense of belonging which is genuinely transformative, anchoring life and bringing joy. This is good in and of itself but it also points to a reality beyond, namely that in living together, navigating differences of opinion and ceaselessly and resolutely continuing to love each other, we demonstrate and make manifest something of the character and life of God. We bring heaven to earth as it were.

As recent news reports make clear, the church doesn't always get this right and indeed it sometimes gets it profoundly wrong, however, it keeps trying because the first person plural matters as an expression of the fullness of life which Christ offers.

The last time you heard from me was in the December edition during the season of Advent. I now have the privilege of sharing with you at the beginning of the other significant season in the church calendar, Lent; the time leading up to Easter.

On the eve of the first day of Lent we traditionally celebrate Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day. But what do pancakes have to do with Lent and Easter?

Well, Lent is a season of 40 days (actually it's 46 - but we don't count Sundays!) and it ends with Easter Sunday and the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. Traditionally these 40 days have been a time of fasting for Christians (not eating) and living more simply. Christians do this to remember the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert after he was baptised and before he started travelling around telling and showing people all about God. During that time in the desert Jesus went without food. He fasted (read about it in Matthew 4). Now while most Christians don't stop eating altogether for 40 days, traditionally they have stopped eating some foods, in particular fatty, rich foods like butter and eggs. That's why on Shrove Tuesday, the day before Lent starts, it has been tradition for people to use up all the remaining fatty foods in their homes, and pancakes have been the best way of doing that. Throughout the history of the church great festivals would have been held where the whole village or town got together to do this. On that note, if you are reading this before March 4th we would love to see you at our Pancake Party at All Saints, Odiham.

For Christians, the purpose of giving up stuff and living more simply over Lent is to create more time to reflect honestly on how you are living and to make more room for the things that make you more human and alive: love, forgiveness, generosity, hospitality... (the things that Jesus typified). If you and your household would like to be more intentional in practising these things over Lent, there's a great resource which you can access using this QR code or visit *flamecreativekids.blogspot.com/2016/02/lent-ideas-for-families-printable.html*

Whether you observe Lent in any particular way this year or not, may you know the immense love and kindness God has for you as shown through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. And, in turn, may you find yourself giving and receiving more love and kindness to and from others.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming News

We've had a glimpse of winter with a week of cold frosty weather but now it's back to being reasonably mild, overcast and wet although a dry week is forecast. A good few weeks of cold, frosty weather would be really welcome to kill off the bugs and diseases that 'trouble' (I was going to say 'plague' but that might be overdoing it thankfully) our crops and livestock. We are being vigilant for signs of Blue Tongue in our cows after some cases have been reported in the South East when the midges that carry it had been blown across the channel from the Continent. Thankfully it doesn't affect the cows too much but there would be a drop in milk for a few weeks. We blood tested some cattle a few weeks ago just to make sure and the results were all negative. A good cold spell would drastically reduce the risk.

The cows have been milking really well this Winter on the grass and maize silages we made last year. They are chomping their way through our silage stocks at an alarming rate, so I've just bought some extra maize from a neighbouring farmer. Our maize and grass silage yields were lower than I'd anticipated last year so that's left us a bit short, so we've had to bolster our stocks. The extra should get us through to October by which time our clamps should be full again. I'm going to plant more maize this Spring to make sure we are not in the same position next year. I like to be in the position of having too much forage in stock but after the two previous disappointing growing seasons due to

lack of sunlight I've been caught out. The area of maize we plant this Spring and the consequent yield we get, should see our maize silage stocks through to January 2027, so it's really important my 'back of an envelope' calculations are correct!

Our milk quality is consistently the best it has ever been with the milk solids running at 62.5kg/cow of Fat and 45.5kg/cow of Protein this month. With our milk yield, that will equate to well over 1,000kg of milk solids/cow/year which is exceptional. We not only get paid by our milk buyer, ARLA, for milk yield but also for quality. There is now huge demand for unprocessed, natural ingredients and protein which is why milk and meat prices are on the rise.

Whey was seen as a byproduct of dairy and fed to pigs a few decades ago but now is hugely in demand to promote muscle growth and tissue repair. You only have to look at the many products available to see its popularity. There was a report you may have seen from Cancer Research UK recently that stated, 'Our new study shows that an extra 300mg of calcium a day - or a large glass of milk - could be linked to a 17% decrease in bowel cancer risk'

With sports stars like Dame Laura Kenny (milk, milk and more milk!) and Erling Haaland (What's your favourite snack? Raw Milk!) promoting milk this has certainly been beneficial marketing with the well informed younger generations watching TikTok. That's possibly a bit ageist but I'm certainly not a TikToker..... if that's a thing?

So now the days are really drawing out and Spring is around the corner after a difficult year last year, the future looks brighter on all fronts.

• Concert in St Mary's Church - Sunday 22nd June 6.00pm

Definitive record of St Mary's Church, Upton Grey

A comprehensive record of the church furnishings at St Mary's has been compiled by the Church Recording Group, Hart Branch, of the Arts Society (NADFAS) and presented to the PCC and the Diocese. It provides a detailed and informative analysis of the interior of the Church, illustrated by first class photographs. It is based on regular visits to St Mary's and extensive research carried out over two years. It is an invaluable source of information.

The Society comments that our Grade I listed Church has much to admire: a wealth of memorials, a fine collection of stained glass, a Norman arch, a fine ring of old and new bells, an interesting Perpendicular font, a turret clock still running after 260 years, and a curious fragment of a 13th century 'momento mori' inscription warning against loose living.

The book contains sections on memorials, metalwork, stonework, woodwork, textiles, paintings, books, windows and miscellaneous items. Interesting biographical details are included particularly on memorials.

Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust - Turning over stones, one turnstone at a time

Turnstones are fascinating shorebirds which are easily recognisable due to their distinctive behaviour and striking plumage. The scientific name of the bird, *Arenaria interpres*, refers to its unique habit of 'turning' over stones and debris in search of food, so is of course, where the name 'turnstone' originates.

During the winter months, these medium-sized waders are a common sight along the shores of Hampshire, particularly in places like Langstone Harbour, the Solent, and along the Isle of Wight's coast.

Despite weighing only around 100g, the turnstone is a remarkable migrant, traveling incredible distances during its seasonal migration. Originating from breeding grounds in northern regions such as Lapland, Greenland, and even as far as Canada, these waders make long, arduous journeys - sometimes covering up to 1,700 miles - to reach their wintering sites.

The UK serves as a crucial stopover on their migratory route, a pit stop to rest and refuel before continuing their journey further south to Africa. These passage migrants rely on the UK's coastal habitats to sustain them during this critical phase of their migration. Although a migrant to the UK, it can also be seen all year-round as different populations arrive throughout the seasons.

The birds seek out the rocky shorelines, tidal mudflats, and sandy beaches where they feed primarily on small invertebrates, crustaceans, and molluscs, often flipping over small rocks and shells with their strong bills to uncover hidden prey.

The turnstones striking plumage changes with the seasons. In summer, their feathers are rich with orange, black, and white tones, making them particularly noticeable against the backdrop of coastal scenery. In winter, their plumage becomes more muted, offering them better camouflage among the pebbles and rocks they scavenge.

They are widely recognised by different names across countries due to their unique habits and widespread distribution. In addition to turnstone, it is also sometimes called the 'sea quail' in coastal communities, referencing its stout build and patterned plumage. In North America, there is also a second species, the 'black turnstone', which lives on the Pacific coast.

Their long-distance migration is a testament to the turnstone's resilience and adaptability. The birds offer a powerful reminder of the interconnectedness of global ecosystems and the importance of preserving coastal habitats for migratory species. Conservation efforts are essential to protecting their habitats and ensuring that future generations will continue to enjoy the sight of these fascinating birds in the wild.
