Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

In Church, we are in the season of Easter and we are looking at the resurrection appearances of Jesus. For Christians now, and over the last 2000 years, they have been part of the proof that Jesus is the Messiah who was promised in the Old Testament, and that He is the Son of God. They are also part of the proof of eternal life, that God raised to life His Son as both a conqueror of death and a pioneer for us to follow. The disciples in



many ways prefigure our own journeys of faith. Before Jesus was arrested, they were close to Him, perhaps hanging on His every word. But when the going got tough, and Jesus was arrested, they fell away. They would have been devastated by His death. Yet His resurrection transformed their lives. They realised that everything He had said was true, and they were inspired to tell everyone about Him to the ends of the known world, and that of course has led to us hearing the Gospel in church. It was the disciples' acceptance of the resurrection that transformed their lives and it is what transforms our lives too.

John the Gospel writer carefully selected his resurrection accounts. He wrote towards the end of his Gospel that he could have written so much more about Jesus, but he carefully selected what he wrote to make the single point: that we would believe that Jesus was the Son of God. We have to remember that the disciples already had seen that Jesus had risen from the dead. They believed and trusted in who Jesus was and He was for this brief time physically moving in and out of their lives as they lived with Him in their hearts.

One of the resurrection stories that is in John's Gospel has Jesus appearing on the shore after Peter and some of the disciples had been fishing all night. They had not caught anything. Then Jesus shouts out to them from the shore, "try the other side of the boat". Their tired eyes and the dim light meant that they could not see who it was who shouted at them, but they heeded the advice and caught a huge haul of fish. They then dragged their full net to the shore and recognised that it was Jesus who had shouted out to them. John recorded that they had caught 153 large fish. Is this just some quaint fishing tale or is there more to it?

For centuries much has been made of the number 153. If you love mathematics then it is both a pyramidic number and the sum of the first five factorial numbers. 153 was apparently believed in Biblical times to represent the total number of known species of fish. It was also linked to the Hebrew words chosen by the prophet Ezekiel when he prophesied about a future restoration and a new creation and relationship with God. Put shortly, 153 was considered to be a number symbolic of the breadth of God's creation and of future hope with God.

This fishing story is one of the last accounts of Jesus on earth with His disciples. It has echoes of the start of his earthly ministry with Jesus calling the disciples, where other Gospels record Jesus as saying that they would be 'fishers of men', a phrase that means they would point men and women towards Jesus, and lead them to faith. If we take this resurrection encounter on the shore, with Jesus being the person that causes it, the number 153 being significant and symbolic, and the calling of the disciples as followers of Jesus to then become 'fishers of men', we see a picture of Jesus commissioning His disciples and all who believe and trust in Him to become 'fishers of men' throughout the world. Jesus was making it clear through the catch of fish that the Gospel was for the whole world. The disciples took heed. Peter spent the next 30 years as the first Bishop of Rome.

As Peter's successor in Rome is being selected, it is worth us all recalling that this is where it all started, with Jesus calling Peter and all those who believe and trust in Jesus to be 'fishers of men' and for the Gospel to be preached to all people from all parts of the world.

Hi everyone!

You are never too small to have big Hope!

Have you ever hoped for something special, like a birthday gift or a fun trip? Hope is when we *believe* something good is coming, even if we can't *see* it yet.

In the Bible, Christian hope is a little like that - but much bigger and stronger! Christian Hope means trusting that God will always keep His promises. His promise that *He loves us*, that *He has a plan for our lives*, that *He wants the best for us*, that *we do not have to worry*, because *he has it under control*... It's not just wishing - it's knowing deep in our hearts that God is good and He is with us, even during hard times.

You are never too small to have big Hope!

Christians believe that Jesus is the reason for our hope. Just a few weeks ago, at Easter, we remembered that He came to earth, died on the cross, and rose again so that we can have a forever friendship with God. And by the time you read this, it will be over there, and already helping people injured in the war. They didn't give up and think there was nothing they could do, they trusted in the hope they had in God, and did something about it.

The Bible says, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him." That means He fills our hearts with joy and peace - like a warm hug from someone who loves us, when we trust in him, when we have Hope. NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming News

Spring is turning into summer following a prolonged dry spell which was needed after the wet winter we had. But it has gone a bit far the other way now if I'm being fussy. The crops have taken up the early fertiliser and are slowly growing away despite the chilly northerly breeze we had been getting. But as we turned the month into May, the warmer weather has arrived and the crops have responded quickly. As I write this we have just had a thunder shower pass over giving a refreshing drink for the spring sown crops of barley and maize. We had just applied the last doses of fertiliser to our crops beforehand so the timings worked out nicely to wash it into the roots of the crops. Not often this happens, more luck than judgement! But this is important as our crops can only uptake the nitrogen fertiliser through its roots.

Although dry, this weather has given us a tremendous amount of sunshine. Which has been great for the flowering period of the oil seed rape crop (OSR). This is essential, as you will know sunlight is the key ingredient for a plant to photosynthesize. Our OSR crop uses its flowers to convert this sunlight and they only flower for a short period of time which is why it's important that the sun shines during this period. The energy provided from the sunlight has a knock on effect to yield. Lack of sunlight will produce shorter pods and smaller seeds. Now the flowers have dropped you can seed the pods forming and filling out with seeds.

The negative impact of the dry weather is now showing in some of the winter wheat plants though. The flag leaf, which is the main leaf of the plant that is usually the broadest leaf, has started the curl up to preserve moisture. The flag leaf is used in the same effect to the flowers of the OSR plants. This broad leaf captures as much sunlight as possible to photosynthesize, so when the leaf curls up it restricts this process and will reduce grain fill which reduces yield. It's not critical yet but some rain wouldn't go a miss! Also I noticed that the Wheat has started to come out in 'ear', this is farmer terminology for the grains emerging from the stem of the plant. This is a lot earlier than usual so another sign that the plant is potentially stressed and is rushing through its growth stages.

Our disappointing crop this year has been the Hybrid rye. This is grown for the Anaerobic digester in Herriard. It is a relatively small seed that is pretty fussy, and needs the weather to be on its side as it starts growing. Which last year it didn't, with a record level of rainfall in September it was always going to have the odds stacked against it. We've got large patches of bare where the slugs decimated it, and other parts of fields where it had waterlogged and the planted drowned out. It is something we are having to adapt to as we seem to be getting prolonged periods of weather, either dry or wet.

On the chicken side of the farm, they are enjoying the sunshine. Being able to range, sunbathe and dust themselves outside certainly makes for happier chicken rather than wading around in mud and puddles! New this year for us is two new nest boxes for the birds to lay their eggs in. This gives more laying area for the hens and makes collecting eggs a lot easier for us, as the laying area is on a slight angle, so when the hen lays its egg it will roll onto a central belt that we can turn and gather all the eggs at the end of the shed. We have also found we are getting less cracked eggs as well which is another bonus.

We are also moving into competition season, these are very much a casual low key, local farmer competitions. But also are a great way of benchmarking with fellow farmers to see how your farm is performing. We enter all the crops we grow as well as the farm business as a whole. But also having a chat with farmers from out of the area and discussing/moaning about our problems and the weather. So fingers crossed for a drop of rain before then!

St Mary's Church, Upton Grey: Did You Know?

In addition to Captain Charles Tyler who fought at the Battle of Trafalgar (see the April edition), other men from our village also fought in the 20-year-long war of national survival against the French forces of Napoleon.

John Henry Beaufoy was aged 4 at the start of the War. He lived at Upton Grey House and worshipped in our Church. Aged 19, he was commissioned into the Royal Fusiliers, with the rank of lieutenant. He joined the British army in the Peninsula under the command of Sir Arthur Wellesley (later the Duke of Wellington). By July 1809 the British Army had forced the French out of Portugal and turned its attention on Spain.

The British army combined with an allied Spanish army west of Talavera and advanced on the French. Unknown to them, the French army had been reinforced, and the Royal Fusiliers were the first to be attacked. As the enemy fell back, the order was given to charge. It seems likely that Lieutenant Beaufoy was at the fore and, with sword in hand, ran towards the enemy, when he became one of the first of his Regiment to die that day. A fine memorial to him appears in our Church.

Thomas Woodman was the son of the landlord of the Hoddington Arms. He fought 6 years later at the Battle of Waterloo on 18 June 1815, serving with 1st Kings Dragoon Guards. He was killed in one of the last cavalry charges made by the Guards on that day. Out of the 530 men of the Kings Dragoon Guards who paraded that morning, only 15 were still in action at the end of the day. Thomas Woodman's widow Ann was provided with a cottage - called 'Waterloo Cottage' - by Lieutenant Beaufoy's Father in the grounds of Upton Grey House, where she lived for many years.

Swift Nest Boxes at Upton Grey

As a follow on to the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust article (see Other News and Events at the end of the Mag), we are very concerned about the rapid decline in Swift numbers. This is almost entirely due to the reduction in available nest sites, and one example is that, in the past, Swifts often made nests of mud under the eaves of houses, attached to the soffit boards beneath the gutters. Unfortunately, most modern houses nowadays use plastic soffits, and mud will not stick to plastic, so Swifts cannot nest on modern buildings.

The answer is to provide Swift nest boxes, and an innovative solution is to put Swift nest boxes in church towers. This idea has been very successful in various churches and cathedrals throughout Hampshire, and last year (2024) we installed Swift nest boxes at three churches in the Benefice, Greywell, Herriard, and Upton Grey. The nest boxes were installed in the bell towers behind the louvres.

However, things at Upton Grey did not turn out as expected, as kestrels and jackdaws nested just below where the nest boxes were installed. So, sadly, we did not get any Swifts nesting last year, but we are keeping our fingers crossed for this year. Nothing



wrong with kestrels and jackdaws, indeed, delightful to see them, but let's hope they nest elsewhere this year.

It's Good to Listen!

As a u3a, we try to be self-sufficient, with members running the vast majority of our groups. However, we also enjoy and benefit from hearing from other people and this has been a bumper month!

The May members monthly meeting was a 'sell out' and extremely well received; the topic was 'The Iranian Embassy Siege - the SAS in action'. This took place in 1980 and many of you will remember the SAS assault, codenamed 'Operation Nimrod', being broadcast live at peak time on 5th May 1980. It



was viewed by millions of people, mostly in the UK, making it an important moment in British history. The presenter, Guy Bartlett, described the siege using first hand testimony from those present but also showed us actual footage that was broadcast by both the BBC and ITV.

Meanwhile Science & Tech had a tale of two horse powers! Firstly, they heard from Alan Frener about the BloodhoundLSR attempting to break the land speed record. In its tests it generated over 135,000 horsepower.



In complete contrast, at a second meeting, David Throup described the Crofton Beam Engine which has operated for over 200 years and is the oldest working beam engine in the world. It generates a more modest 40 horsepower.

At our Health and Wellbeing Study Day there were a succession of presentations including representatives from Mind and The Macular Society. Both presentations covered the very important support and advice these organisations could provide to people in need.

However, our members have been getting in on the act too! At a recent meeting of the Environment & Climate group, one of the members gave a presentation 'How to save the planet - one bathroom at a time!' The focus was on removing single use plastic packaged products and what could be bought and used instead. The member then spent hours recording her advice as a video so that others could access the information!

National Garden Scheme - Hampshire

Community Garden Grants: in 2011 the National Garden Scheme launched its Community Garden Grants - since then £1,202,360 has been donated to over 500 community projects. The 2025 Grants have recently been announced, and I am pleased to say that a total of £8,212 has been

awarded to three projects within Hampshire; they are the YMCA Southampton, Dementia Friendly Hampshire (based in Havant), and The Healthy Haven, Southampton. The total amount donated in 2025 to Community Projects was a staggering £294,260. This went to a total of 117 community garden projects across England, Wales and Northern Ireland. To help us raise funds for the Community Garden Grants and our annual Beneficiary Donations, all you have to do is simply visit an NGS garden - just one visit helps. Here are a couple of suggestions for the end of June and July:

Mill House, Vyne Road, Sherborne St John, Basingstoke RG24 9HU. Opening: Thursday & Sunday 26th & 29th June, 2.00pm to 6.00pm. Pre-booking available. Admission £5.00, children free. Cashless Payments available. Refreshments: Home-made teas (in aid of Bramley Church + 10% to NGS). Planted on heavy clay, the gardens of Mill House are relatively young, but occupy an historic site. They surround a recently rebuilt watermill which generates domestic electricity. Rural in feel, despite its proximity to Basingstoke, it features several differing zones. Tended solely by the owners, the structure and planting has been chosen to facilitate easy maintenance (by hand, powered machinery and sheep) to save time. Static and moving water provide interest and a haven for waterfowl, pied wagtails, swans and kingfishers.

If you missed this garden in April, here is an opportunity to visit again. This time around it will look a whole lot different.

The North Hants National Trust Centre members were treated on Thursday 27th March, after the excellent Spring lunch, to a very entertaining, in fact quite titillating, lecture entitled "Secrets, Scandals and Salacious Gossip of the Royal Court, 1660-1830" by Sarah Slater, a white-badge guide lecturer at Hampton Court Palace and also a South Central blue badge tourist guide. Sarah spoke very clearly and amusingly, keeping us all so well entertained that there was no risk of anyone nodding off!

Sarah's lecture was supported by excellent slides, and we began with some beautiful pictures of Hampton Court, lived in by every monarch right through from when Henry VIII, who effectively grabbed it off Cardinal Wolsey, to George III. This included pictures of the alterations made by William III and Queen Mary II, so we were entertained by an interesting digression into questions over the sexuality of both of those dual monarchs, about both of whom there was gossip,

but no proof. For the benefit of those with a rather hazy knowledge of the line of succession, after the exclusion of the Catholic descendants of James II, we were also shown a clear family tree making clear how the monarchs after Queen Anne (the four Georges and their descendants) inherited the throne.

Our lecturer then took us forward to the Victorian period (slightly beyond our official timeline), pointing out that the Victorians were not really prudes so much as people simply trying to deal with the inevitable social and economic consequences of casual sex and also of simply having too many children born within marriage. We learned about the many different types of whores, from the lowest to the highest kept mistresses. There was even a book called Harrison's List, which listed all the prostitutes in London, along with their prices and specialities!

Working backward through the time period, we learned of the famously disastrous marriage of the Prince Regent and Caroline of Brunswick, of the sad life of George I's wife Sophia Dorothea and many others. Charles II's busy love life also inevitably received attention, with his many acknowledged mistresses and illegitimate children - though I always feel one should add in his favour that he always treated his wife, Catherine of Braganza, with respect and refused the advice of those telling him he should divorce her and remarry in order to produce a legitimate heir. He was clearly a much kinder individual than Henry VIII! One of history's great "What Ifs?" Had Charles II taken that cruel advice, poor Catherine would have suffered - but we would not have had the disastrous reign of James II, the Glorious Revolution with William III and Mary, the Georgians, the Jacobite rebellions ... and so on.

The lecture was in some ways not for the faint-hearted, as we learned much about the various ways in which people tried to limit their families through some fairly primitive types of contraception - some more effective than others. It was amusing and interesting, and a serious reminder that sex wasn't invented yesterday! I particularly liked the tale of Theresa Constantia Phillips, who had a shop called 'The Green Canister' in Half Moon Street, Covent Garden, now Bedford Street. She sold the very best condoms, which could be washed and re-used - and which even commanded a good second-hand price! The mind boggles!

The North Hampshire National Trust Centre (NHNTC) AGM

At our AGM in April, the programme of visits was presented and discussed. In May we went to Hever Castle in Kent – the 14th century castle which was the childhood home of Ann Boleyn. In June the outing will be to Kew Gardens. Founded in 1759 these sumptuous gardens remain at the forefront of plant and fungal science and are hugely important for their conservation programmes. In July we have a double event. We start at Beale Wildlife Park, the home of a wide variety of uncommon and endearing species. In the afternoon we visit the nearby Basildon Park House, a fine 18th century dwelling with a chequered past. In August we have a cream tea and in September we will have a tour of The Wakes, Gilbert White's home in Selborne.

Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust – New nesting tower gives Swifts and House Martins a Lifeline

A specially designed nesting tower has been installed at Blashford Lakes Nature Reserve to support struggling populations of swifts and house martins.

It marks Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust's first nesting tower across its estate and provides much-needed secure nesting sites for these red-listed bird species.

Swifts and house martins have experienced significant population declines in recent decades, due to habitat loss and a reduction in suitable nesting sites. The UK breeding population of swifts have declined by 66 percent between 1995 and 2022, while house martins have declined by 44 per cent.

Standing five metres tall, the tower features 23 swift boxes and 12 house martin cups, offering much-needed breeding opportunities. It incorporates ventilation to keep the nests cool during warmer months and is equipped with solar panels and speakers to play pre-recorded bird calls, attracting young birds searching for a nesting site to settle into.

"This is the first nest tower of its kind across the Trust's entire estate," said Jack Medley, Reserves Officer at Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust. "It marks a significant milestone in our ongoing efforts to help swifts and house martins, two remarkable species facing serious challenges. The tower is part of our commitment to providing innovative solutions that help these birds thrive."

Swifts and house martins migrate from sub-Saharan Africa to breed in the UK, depending on suitable nesting sites and an abundant insect population. Historically, swifts have nested in the roofs of older buildings, but modern renovations are sealing up access points, leaving them without suitable breeding spaces. The new tower mimics natural nesting conditions, offering a secure, predator-free location, giving these birds a vital lifeline.

Jack says: "Swifts and house martins are remarkable birds that complete incredible migrations from Africa each year. By providing secure nesting spaces at Blashford Lakes Nature Reserve, we're giving them a fighting chance to stabilise and recover. It's fantastic to see this conservation effort come to life."

The tower also provides easy access to a rich supply of insects, their primary food source. The wetlands, reed beds, and woodlands at Blashford Lakes Nature Reserve



create perfect conditions for insects to flourish, ensuring the birds have the resources they need to thrive during the breeding season.

Bringing this vision to life required a combination of expert knowledge, skilled design, and generous support, as Jack explains: "I'm incredibly proud of this project and would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone who made it a reality. A special thank you goes to Hampshire Ornithological Society for their generous funding, Hampshire Swifts for their expert advice and guidance, and to Peak Boxes for their craftsmanship.

"This tower represents a huge step in our ongoing conservation efforts to protect these vulnerable species, and we couldn't have achieved it without the support of our partners and the dedication of so many involved."

Located next to the site's largest Lake, Ibsley Water, the tower is viewable near Goosander hide. It will be closely monitored, with data collected on nest occupancy each year.
